**Obituary**

**MR. MAURICE FITZGERALD,**  
**BARRIGONE.**

With deep regret we announce  
 the death of Mr. Maurice Fitz-  
 gerald, I.C.C. official, Barrigone,  
 which took place at his residence  
 on the 7th instant. Maurice be-  
 longed to a family widely known  
 and highly esteemed throughout  
 the County. He was a man of  
 many outstanding qualities and  
 his untimely death evoked wide-  
 spread regret amongst a very wide  
 circle of relatives and friends. His  
 passing leaves a place which can  
 not be filled again with the same  
 unassuming personality, cheerful-  
 ness and politeness which endeared  
 him to all who knew him. No doubt  
 patrons of coursing and the Lime-  
 rick Track, of which he was Ras-  
 ing Manager, will miss his genial  
 presence, as he always fulfilled his  
 arduous duties in an upright and  
 courteous manner.

He was ever a keen sportsman,  
 a great lover of dogs and horses  
 and above reproach in all his  
 sporting activities.

His popularity and the esteem in  
 which he was held by the people of  
 Munster were manifest when his  
 remains were removed to Robert-  
 town Church. His funeral cortege  
 was one of the largest and most  
 representative ever seen to pass  
 through the villages of Foynes,  
 Loughill, and his native Glin, to
