THE SNAKE-DANCE OF THE MOKIS. Unique among barbaric customs is the snake-dance of the Moki Indians in north-eastern Arizona.

When during August the sun is at its setting glints the sacred rock that stands before the door of the tribal kiva, the old medicine-man, Hosa, mounts the highest point at either side and solemnly chanting a hymn that sixteen months hence the solemn ceremonies will take place.

At its close the Indian spectators have risen to their feet, and are waving their arms and bodies in air. The snakes point to their branches of a cottonwood shrub, known as the kiki, just where it has stood on Moki dance days for countless generations.
