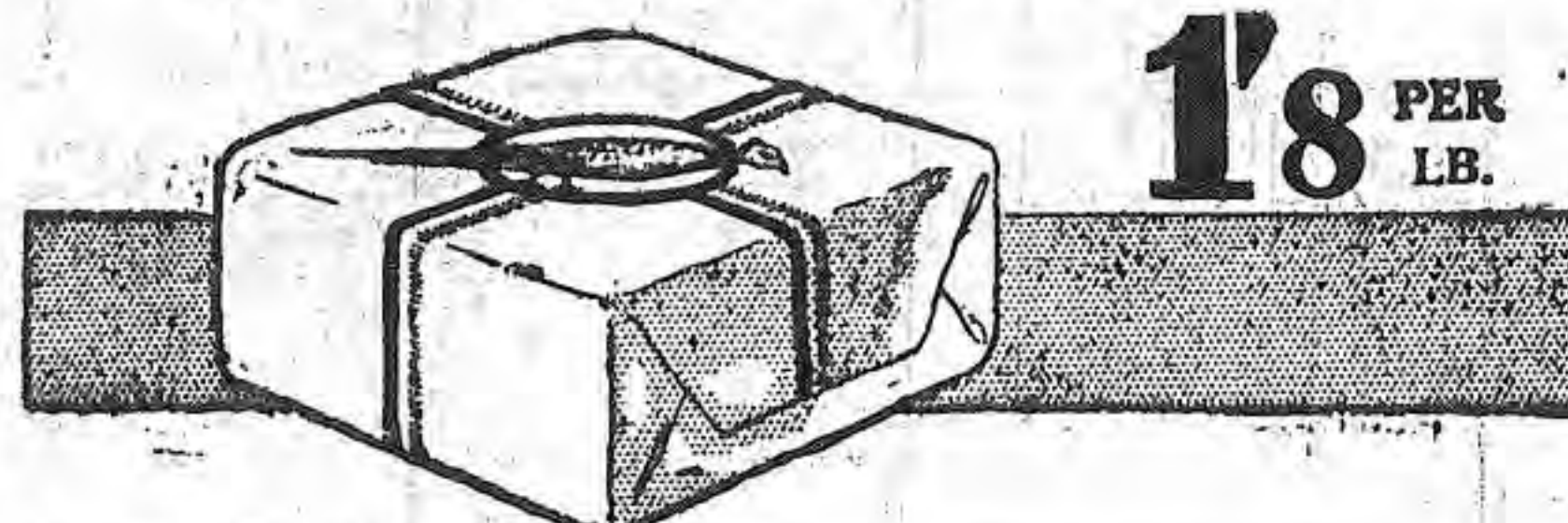

THE FARMERS' UNION CONGRESS

Important Questions Discussed. At the Farmers' Union Congress in Dublin on Friday the future of the agricultural industry and the prices of agricultural produce were the questions taken up.

Mr. McLaughlin (Ox Louh) referred to the prices charged to the consumers for bacon. It was found that the price of a certain quantity of bacon had risen from 10s. 6d. to 12s. 6d. in the last two years.

On the motion of Mr. Heekin (Waterford), the following resolution was adopted: "That in the opinion of this Congress, the most feasible solution of the question of the unimproved tenancy is through State purchase.

On the motion of Col O'Callaghan Westropp, the following resolution was unanimously passed: "That at the present time the Government, and all concerned, the national and equitable importance of immediately carrying to completion by land purchase, the establishment of occupying ownership in Ireland."

FUMAROLAS. Just as there are few explosives which do not emit more or less poisonous gases, there are few, if any, volcanoes which do not give off numerous vapours, writes "Akon" in "Everyman".

FRUIT ACIDS FROM BENZOL. Coal-tar can now be made to yield tartaric acid and other important substances. The details were explained in a joint paper read before the American Chemical Society by the inventors of the process, John M. Weiss and C. R. Downs.
