RESIDENTIAL QUALIFICATIONS.

Scholarships shall be restricted to pupils who are of Irish birth and whose parents or guardians have been resident in the County for five years.

OTHER QUALIFICATIONS.

Children of labourers or farmers whose valuation does not exceed £20 shall be entitled to a full Scholarship. Children of farmers whose valuation exceeds £20 but does not exceed £50 may, at the discretion of the Committee, receive reduced Scholarships.

EXAMINATION.

Candidates for Scholarships shall be subjected to a competitive examination - oral and written - to be held by Examiners appointed by the Committee.

GENERAL POWERS.

The Committee reserve to themselves the right to exclude any candidate from competing for a Scholarship without assigning a reason.

BYLLABUS.

The following is the list of subjects for examination (written and oral) as may be necessary: IRISH, IRISH HISTORY, LATIN, FRANCIS, ARITHMETIC, ALGEBRA, GEOMETRY, BOTANY, DOMESTIC SCIENCE, ENGLISH, HISTORY, and ENGLISH. Irish and Irish History are essential; any other three subjects from the foregoing list 100 marks will be assigned to each subject.
