The following letter was addressed to the Press on Thursday evening:—"St. Margaret's, Limerick, 10/3/21. I am quite willing to appear before a jury of my countrymen, and to give evidence and assist in any way possible to clear up this case. I have several times conveyed my decision on this point to the commandant."
