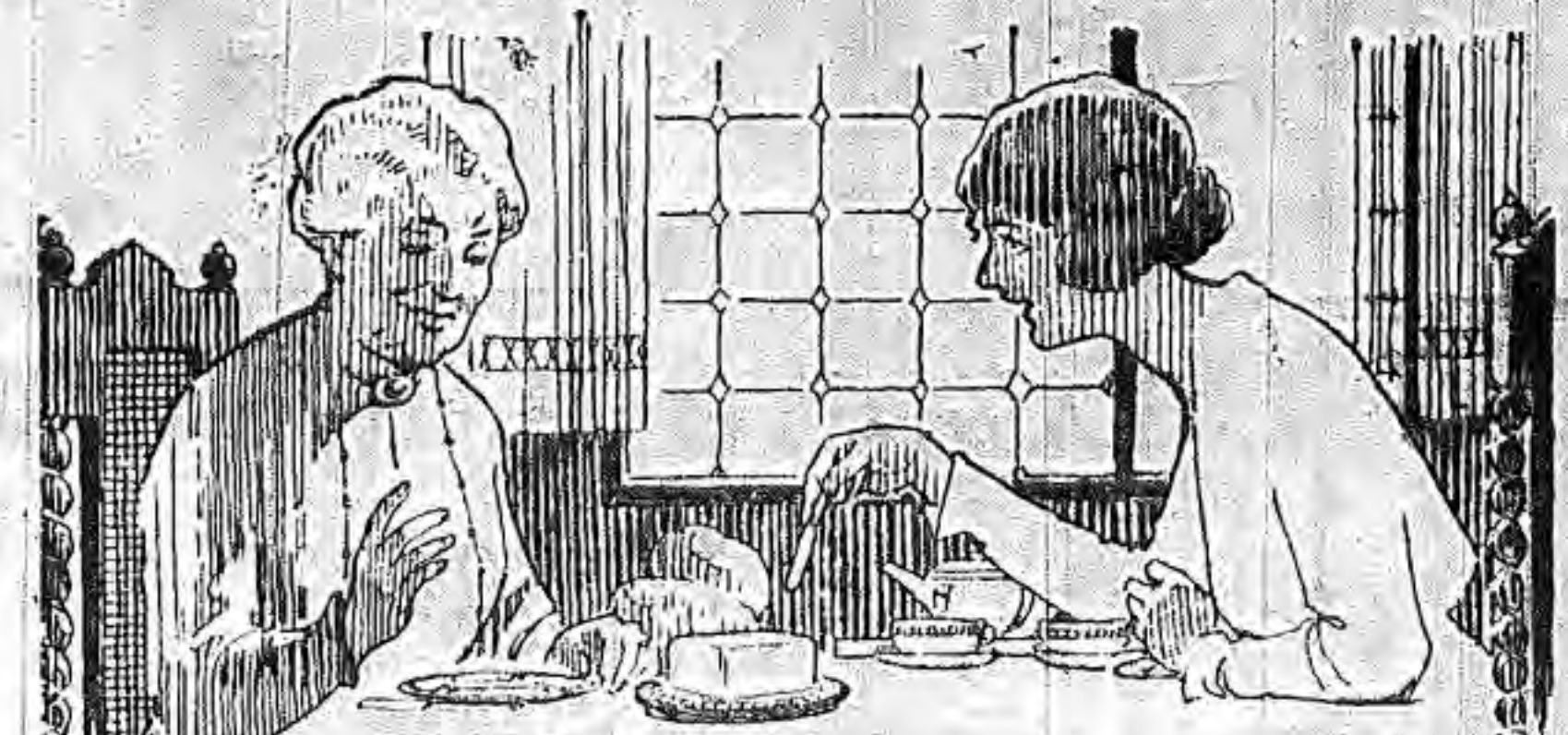

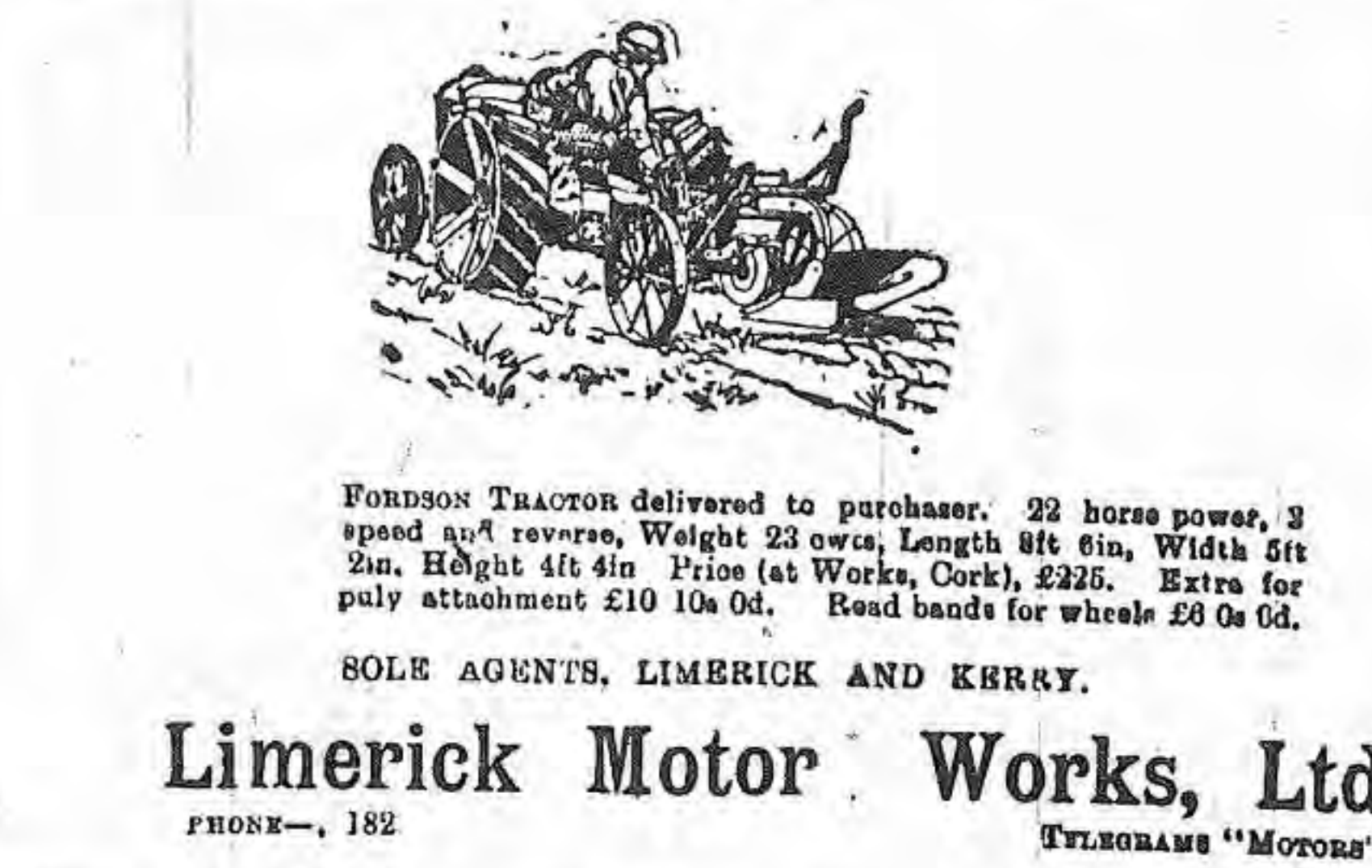

Annual General Meeting

At the 44th annual general meeting of the shareholders of Cannock & Co., Ltd., held at the Company's offices on Wednesday, 20th March, 1921, Mr. David Tidmarsh, President, and also present—Messrs W. Walsh, P. Gleeson, Directors; J. B. Gaffney, A. Blood-Smith, J. H. Roche, J. Walsh, J. P. O'Riordan, J. O'Keefe, W. W. Walsh, R. Toppin, W. Hough, J. McCarthy, N. Hayes, and M. Griffin, Shareholders.

Mr. W. Walsh said—Before commencing the ordinary business of the meeting it is my pleasant duty as the Director, present to express our regret at the death of our late esteemed Chairman, Mr. Tidmarsh, who was a Director of the Company since its foundation in 1877, and Chairman for the past 24 years or so. He devoted nearly all his time and attention to the interests of the Company. His death is very sadly felt by his co-Directors, and his genial and kindly personality will long be missed by all who had the pleasure of doing business with him. A resolution to record on the Company's minutes the regrets of the shareholders, and their sympathy with his family will be duly proposed. The Directors are very glad, and the shareholders will, I am sure, be also well pleased that his son succeeds him as Chairman of the Company, to continue the family's long standing interest in its welfare.

The notice convening the meeting having been read.

The Chairman said—Gentlemen, with your permission I will, as usual, take the report and statement of accounts, with the Auditor's report, as read. The Director who has the pleasure of presenting the report, and who has the honor of the trading is not quite up to the standard of the last two or three years. But this is the experience of nearly all the companies, both British and Irish, whose balance sheets have been published, and notwithstanding special adverse circumstances, amongst them disruption of railway services to or from Limerick for several months, we have comparatively held our own, and the majority of other drapery houses. Our financial position maintains its unique strength. We have no trade creditors, having paid prompt cash for all our purchases during the year. I now beg to propose that the report and statement of accounts be adopted, and that a dividend for the half-year ended 31st January last at the rate of 10 per cent per annum free of Income Tax be declared, carrying £2,000 to the credit of General Reserve Account, and £18,516 2s 11d forward to closing year.

The motion was seconded by Mr. P. Gleeson, and passed unanimously.

On the motion of Mr. J. H. Roche, seconded by Mr. J. P. O'Riordan, Messrs David Tidmarsh and William Walsh were re-elected Directors of the Company. Messrs Craig, Gardner & Co were also re-elected asitors.

Mr. J. B. Gaffney, CB, proposed a resolution expressing the regret of the shareholders at the death of the late Chairman, Mr. David Tidmarsh. In doing so the speaker referred to his long friendship with the deceased gentleman. They were as related together on many occasions, and the Chairman was ever ready to place at the public disposal for charitable purposes his well known musical abilities. The death of Mr. Tidmarsh was deeply felt by the body of citizens, and they sympathised sincerely with the family. During his chairmanship of the Company he had been prosperous, and the speaker hoped that under the guidance of and with the whole-hearted help of his experienced and able co-Directors, the new Chairman, Mr. David Tidmarsh, would have the same success as his father had.

Mr. Blood-Smith, in seconding, said—Mr. Chairman, I have been asked to second the motion so eloquently proposed by my friend, Mr. Gaffney, and I gladly do so, desiring to place on record my own appreciation of the services rendered by the late Chairman, and the deep regret that both myself and everyone interested in Messrs Cannock & Co feel at his loss. I have been a shareholder in the Company for about 30 years, and during all that time the late Mr. Tidmarsh was an admirable manager in the management of the firm, and it has been to his great abilities, ably assisted by the other directors, through good times and bad, that we are able to be in a position of financial success. I wish to say a few words in praise of the very important and very onerous position which you now occupy, and I hope you will have a long and prosperous term of office. Your position is not an easy one, for your father has left you a very high ideal, and his great success makes it all the more difficult for you to fill the place I wish you every success, and I can express no greater wish than that in years to come it may be said of you in the discharge of the business you have undertaken that you have been successful, and your management should be a source of pride to all who are associated with the firm.

Mr. W. Walsh said—On behalf of the staff I wish to join in the vote of condolence, and to cordially welcome and congratulate our new Chairman on his appointment.

The proceedings terminated with a vote of thanks to the Chairman, Directors, and Staff proposed by Mr. M. Griffin, seconded by Mr. Roche, and suitably replied to.

COUNTY LIMERICK FARMERS' ASSOCIATION.

Meeting of Eflin Branch.

A meeting of the Eflin Branch of the County Limerick Farmers' Association was held on the 27th inst. Owing to the circumstances that prevail in the Kilmallock district the meeting was comparatively small, but representative of the farmers of the district.

Mr. J. O'Riordan, President, and in addressing the meeting, laid particular stress on the necessity of a Union amongst farmers. He stated agriculture is Ireland's only large industry, and the importance of raising food for the Nation could not be too highly estimated. If the farmer is compelled to work at a disadvantage the Nation as a whole suffers. He asked why the farmers did not combine long before now. A Farmers' Association, formed on the lines of the present one, could accomplish many things that would not be at all to the detriment of the farmer but to the Nation. In their districts they had done a little by co-operation but there should be co-operation in the raising, marketing, and manufacturing of agricultural products. Denmark could be a great deal in the way of co-operation in practice. The Danish Government directly and indirectly subsidised the raising of agricultural produce. Nature only was the friend of the Irish farmer. The Irish agricultural products are second to none in the world, but the Irish farmer does not take the necessary steps to convince the consumer of the excellence of his products. It could not be expected that other people would do his business. Nobody could accurately estimate what Ireland lost in pre-war days in the sale of her produce. It was only by combination and co-operation that the Irishman would come into his own.

Mr. Walsh, organiser, in addressing the meeting, said that the Chairman had put the points before the meeting so admirably that he would not be a little left for him to speak about. Mr. O'Riordan had dwelt on the necessity of union in their business. There was no doubt Mr. O'Riordan sees in the future that the Irish farmer must put that himself if he means to live and thrive in their own land. This is the sign of the times, and it is well known that those who are not prepared to combine have the effect of increasing the price of their products. As an example they would permit him to mention the recent embargo placed on the exportation of Irish butter and bacon. The embargo placed on these two products led to disastrous results. The pig was the poor man's "savings bank," and his class of organised labour turned the savings bank into a "losing bank" in the agricultural labourer and small farmer. The Irish farmer must see the moral aspect of their disposal of the products of their industry, viz. organisation and co-operation on a large scale. Practically the co-operation is only in its infancy in Ireland, and the possibilities before it are great. The spirit of co-operation was very evident in that district of Eflin. They had their co-operative creamery and their gridding mill. These showed plainly an enterprising spirit amongst them, and they themselves could see at once what was and what does not. The young farmer is trained to be a business man, a sound and keen one, and in time he would be the roughest fighter in his national fabric. He (sprakes) did not wish to detain them as he had to attend another meeting, but he would not go without testifying to the excellent efforts of the branch. Mr. O'Riordan is a sound thinker, and Mr. M. A. Carroll as Hon Secretary is a sound and hard worker. No words of his could adequately thank those gentlemen for their services.

RUNNING FIGHT IN WEST LIMERICK.

One Man Killed.

General Military Headquarters issued the following report on Thursday morning:

"Yesterday afternoon Crown forces surprised a party of armed rebels in Ballyshahilly, County Limerick, and a running fight ensued, during which one rebel was killed, and four rebels were seen to be carried away."

"One shot gun, one revolver, and some articles of military equipment were captured by the Crown forces, whose only casualty was one policeman slightly wounded."

"The name of the man killed is stated to be James Finn, described as a commandant of the Republican Army."

MR DE VALERA AND COMING IRISH ELECTIONS.

Mr De Valera declares, regarding the Premier's recent speech, that no offer of Dominion Home Rule had been made by the Government. No ban would be put by De Valera on the coming Irish elections.

DAYLIGHT SAVING.

To-night all clocks and watches are to be put on one hour in accordance with the requirements of the Daylight Saving Act.

ESTATE SUB-AGENT SHOT DEAD NEAR BANDON.

It is officially stated that Mr Fred Steening, a land agent, residing at Inchannon, near Bandon, was shot dead on Wednesday night in his house by three armed men.

A Bandon correspondent states:—Two men called at the house about 9.30 o'clock, and Mr Steening answered the knock. He was immediately shot, a revolver falling, it is stated, taking effect in the head. Mr Steening, who was aged about 65, was a sub-agent on the estate of Mr Hugh Moreton Frewen, collected the rents of the house property in the village of Inchannon, and was also a wood ranger. He was interested in fishing and shooting and had some hatches. He leaves a widow and two daughters. His only son was killed in the late war.

THE ROSCARBERY BARRACK ATTACK.

Two Policemen Killed, Many Wounded.

With reference to the attack on Roscarbery (Co Cork) Barrack on Thursday morning a telegram received at Dublin Castle goes to show that the British troops, which comprised one head company of 15 sergeants, and nineteen constables, put up a most sturdy defence.

Sergeant Chen and Constable Borles were killed, and buried in the rubble of the explosion, which blew out the barrack front, took down the Head Constable Neary, and Constables Bradley, Woodford, Sullivan, O'Keefe, Roberts, Doyle, Kinella, and Hishen were wounded.

The attackers possessed of the police arms and ammunition, as these were left behind in the barrack, when the police jumped for their lives from the upper window at 7 a.m. after beating off the rebels.

The attackers carried away their dead and wounded.

All the police are now accounted for.

SEARCHES NEAR ENNIS.

On Wednesday morning large parties of military and police, under D. I. Byrne, Ennis, carried out exhaustive searches in the Cragleigh and Bushy Park districts, about two miles from the town. Many houses were visited, and young men named Fitzpatrick and Callinan were arrested.
