FUNERAL OF DR J F SHANAHAN.

COURTMARTIAL IN CORK.

County Limerick Man Charged. A military court sat at Victoria Barracks Cork yesterday to hear charges against Thomas Leahy of Turowalla, in the County of Limerick, of having (1) at Castlefield, Kerry, on the 1st day of March, 1921, been improperly in possession of arms, viz.—one automatic pistol; (2) being in possession of ammunition, viz.—80 rounds of pistol ammunition.

REMOVAL OF BREAD CONTROL.

Following the removal of the Bread Control on March 31st, the price of flour has been raised throughout the country by 3s 4d a sack. This represents an increase of one penny per stone, including cost of bag, but so far as the consumer is concerned it is not likely that there will be an increase in the price of the loaf in Limerick.
