

CARDINAL LOGUE AND AN IRISH PEACE

Speaking at a Confirmation Service at Clonsilla, Co. Tyrone, on Thursday, Cardinal Logue said that he wished to warn the people against the commission of any crime.

A great many people, including a number of influential persons in Ireland and England, were making an effort to establish peace, and he knew for a fact that if the people of Ireland abandoned crime they could obtain everything that was necessary for their country.

An Irish Republic, his Eminence added, they would never achieve so long as England had a man to fight. If they got a full measure of Self-Government, with control of taxation, that would give them all they asked for.

He warned the youth of the country against old stagers who seemed to love organising those crimes.
