LIMERICK COUNTY COUNCIL. Scheme for Scholarships From Primary to Secondary Schools in County Limerick.

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS. Six of the annual value of £40. The Committee shall be empowered to receive the value of the Scholarship where the pupil's parents or guardians are in a position to bear part of the expense of his or her education. The Committee shall, however, have power to make a supplementary grant not exceeding 25 per centum towards the maintenance of any scholar whose parents are unable to meet the expenses incidental to residence in a Secondary School.
