SHIPPING AT LIMERICK PORT. Trade at the port of Limerick is at present unusually brisk, a number of vessels being in the course of discharge. In addition to the overseas vessels with grain cargoes for Messrs. Bannatyne and Sons, there are being discharged cargoes of various kinds, including iron, tin, and other commodities. General cargo, as well as coal, cement, flour, and timber, constitute the consignments of these vessels, the loading of which gives a good deal of employment.
