THE WAGES QUESTION. All over the country there is greater or less degrees of difference of opinion regarding the question of wages and how they are to be met by employers, owners of small establishments especially, are to have with the men a share of the profits to which they are entitled. The question is a very ticklish one, but is not outside the range of possible and satisfactory arrangement. Indeed, there is evidence already that this is the case, and one has only to look at the friendly offices exercised in Cork by a Catholic clergyman resulting as those services did in the return of the railwaymen on strike to work. It would not be to the benefit of the country that strained relations should continue to exist for employers and every well wisher of Ireland's prosperity, including workers and the employers who provide work will join in the endeavour to smoothen differences, certainly not to provoke them where the common good is so vitally concerned. That is the trend of public opinion on the whole question, and on the minor issues which are dependent on it. Just now a fresh difficulty has arisen. One sees it clearly in the railway trouble between the men and the directors, but black as the prospect looked a few weeks ago the atmosphere has perceptibly cleared, and there is a very reasonable hope that the remaining difficulties will also be amicably adjusted. The labour problem one can observe, is very largely influenced by the high prices of food respecting which the higher authorities it must be said were so supine, and threaten to remain so. These high prices close on three years after the Armistice, wear all the grime of excess, and are a severe trial on people with limited means, whose expenditure is all but ground over the high food prices prevailing. All through the war there was ground for their existence, ground not quite covered or met by increases of workers' wages from time to time. Many things were tolerable in war time, and heroically were they borne for country's sake. That was justified high food prices, but now after that great war, bravely fought, and gallantly and nobly won, the reduction of food prices should not be lost sight of, attention not exclusively given altogether to reductions of workers' wages. These latter reductions it may be allowed at once, will have to be considered; but the reduction of food prices in all possible cases should not be ignored. Through the war, and since its termination, many economists have held and maintained that reductions of wages should be made, but only when those reductions went so as to bring hand-in-hand with the reductions in the high prices which the whole community have to pay for the public food supply. So far the question is, however, but a study and not an operative one.

IRISH PEACE MOVE.

Dail Eireann's Reply to Mr Lloyd George. It was officially stated yesterday that the reply from the Ministry of Dail Eireann was handed to Mr Lloyd George on Thursday night.
