The long-delayed sitting of the Cabinet, appointed while Parliament was assembled, met at Whitehall on Tuesday to consider the question of unemployment, and the application of a remedy. For weeks and weeks past the urgency of the question has been apparent to the whole country in the unrest evident among large numbers of the working population of Great Britain and the disturbances that took place in several districts as the result.
