AMERICANS LEAVE ADRIATIC. Milan, Wednesday.—The United States warships which have been patrolling the Adriatic shores since the armistice will leave for America during the coming week-end.

Railway Shopmen. Arbitration Court Sits. At the Ministry of Labour yesterday, Lord Justice O'Connor sat as arbitrator in the case of the dispute of the shopmen employed by the Midland Railway and the D.S.E. Railway Companies.

U.S. ARMY TO RETURN HOME. Senator Henry Cabot Lodge, Chairman of the United States Senate Committee of Foreign Affairs, and the majority of President Harding in the Senate, has announced that the American army of occupation on the Rhine, will begin to return to the United States at once.

COAL CRISIS. A Serious Outlook. The Executive of the Miners' Federation met at their headquarters in River Square, London, yesterday. The main business was the discussion of means for carrying on the industry after the Government subsidy ends.

THE ALLIES AND GERMANY. M. Briand has informed the French Cabinet that Germany has accepted the conditions laid down in an agreement between the Allies regarding the rail of the stations and the establishment of inter-Allied control on the Rhine frontier.

70 YEARS IN PRISON. An Whelan (81), one of the oldest convicts in Parkhurst Prison, died from disease of the heart on Monday. He was 70 years of age when he was first sentenced to life imprisonment in 1851.

TREASURY BOND CHANGE. £125,000,000 to Date. The Lord Commissioners of the Treasury announce that the present series of Treasury Bonds will be brought to an end on Saturday, October 1. The receipts, including conversions, have exceeded £125,000,000.

MR BALFOUR BROWNE, K.C. The death occurred suddenly from heart failure at Goldfields, near Dumfries, on Tuesday night of Mr Balfour Browne, K.C., a well-known leader at the Glasgow Bar.

OPPAU D'ASSTER. Berlin, Wednesday.—The directors of the Oppau Works state that the remaining work they will not employ the same products as hitherto in the manufacture of fertilizers unless the effects of their component parts are clearly known.

DIPHTHERIA & SCARLATINA EPIDEMIC. City Health Officer's Report. At a meeting of the Corporation Public Health Committee last night, Alderman Mrs O'Donovan, Deputy Mayor, presiding, a report dated 29th instant was read from Dr M. S. McGrath, Medical Superintendent of the City of Health, with reference to the outbreak of diphtheria and scarlatina in the city.

FOOD PRICES. In at least one instance in the Grand Parade Market a prominent Cork butcher is selling beef and mutton at a flat rate of 4s 4d per lb. It is stated that some of the outside shops are retailing at this figure.

CANADIAN CATTLE REPORT. At the National Federation of Meat Traders Association's Conference at Wolverhampton, yesterday, a resolution was carried requesting the Government to put into operation immediately the recommendations of the Royal Commission on the importation of store cattle and the withdrawal of the embargo on Canadian store cattle.

THE LATE PRIVATE H. W. BLACK. The remains of the late Private Harry W. Black, who was killed in action at Passchendaele, Belgium, on Sunday last, arrived in Limerick to-day. The funeral takes place at 2 o'clock to-morrow from the N. B. House for interment in the family burial place.

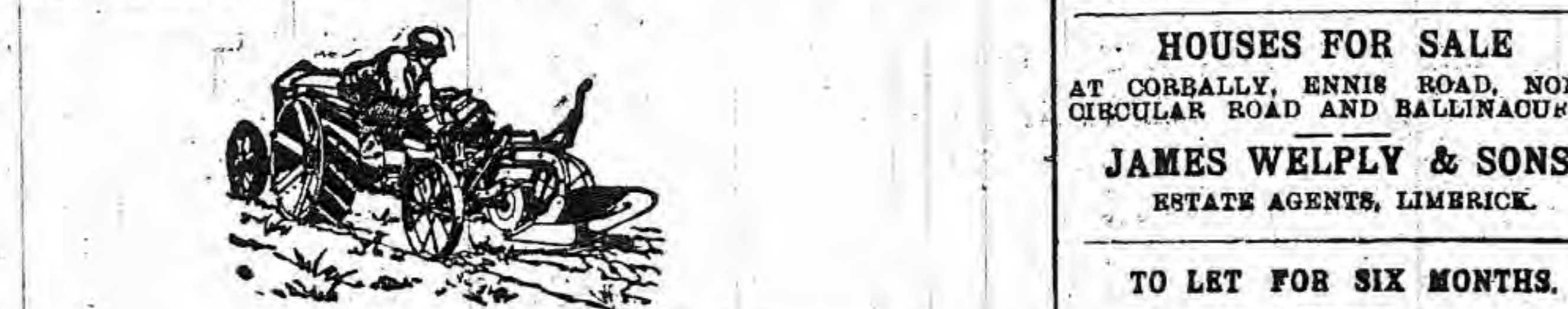

Scheme for Scholarships From Primary to Secondary Schools in County Limerick

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS. Six of the annual value of £40.
