Presentation in Dublin.

A meeting of friends of the Very Rev. H. Vere White, Dean of Christ Church, was held in the boardroom of the Association for the promotion of Church Knowledge last week.

An interesting ceremony took place in the Chapter House of Christ Church Cathedral, Dublin, on Saturday last, when the Very Rev. the Dean (Very Rev. H. Vere White) was made the recipient of a handsome presentation on the occasion of his appointment as Bishop of the Diocese of Limerick.

FOR THE HOME. PRACTICAL HOUSEWIFE.

(A) The Primary School from which the pupil comes must have adopted the Gaelic League Education Programme...

REMARKS.

The tenors of these Scholarships shall be four years provided the pupil shows satisfactory progress as tested by (a) the periodical school examination...

QUALIFICATIONS.

Children of labourers or farmers whose valuation does not exceed £20 shall be entitled to a full Scholarship...

AGE LIMIT.

Pupils shall be eligible for scholarships up to, but not exceeding 16 years on the first of June.

REFERENCES.

Every candidate for a Scholarship shall, before being admitted for examination, produce a satisfactory reference from the Teacher or School Manager...

AWARDS.

Scholarships shall be awarded strictly in order of merit.

EXAMINATION.

Candidates for Scholarships shall be admitted to a competitive examination—oral and written—to be held by Examiners appointed by the Committee.

GENERAL POWERS.

The Committee reserves to itself the right to exclude any candidate from competing for a Scholarship without assigning a reason.

SYLLABUS.

The following is the list of subjects for examination (written and oral) as may be necessary:— Irish, English, Latin, French, History, Geography, Botany, Domestic Science, Rural Science, Geometry and Algebra.

DONOR BORROW.

In your own town or neighbourhood. Donor Borrow is a system of borrowing money from your own town or neighbourhood.
