IRISH INDUSTRIES

The proceedings of the All Ireland Industrial Conference at the sittings in Dublin possess a keen interest for all sections of the community. The Conference has done invaluable work in the past and now after a lapse of nine years resumes its propaganda with a big field before it and under changed conditions for Irish trade and commerce, compared with the period immediately preceding the war.
