SOME SPRING CLEANING HINTS.

CLEANING CEILING. Smoke-blackened ceilings can be cleaned with a thick paste of starch and water. Apply this with a thick pad made of old woolen rags, and when thoroughly dry brush off with a soft brush. Never attempt to whitewash a smoky ceiling; but if cleaning is not enough do not be afraid to try whitewashing. The "mixture" can be made by making two cakes of common whiting into a paste with warm water; add a pound of size (previously melted in a saucepan) and a small cake of washing-day soap (dissolved in water). Mix together, then add a tablespoonful of alum; strain through canvas, add sufficient water to bring to the normal consistency of whitewash, and apply, if possible, with a proper brush. Two coats will be required usually; the first one should be very thin, and the second should not be applied until the first is quite dry. FRESHENING WALLPAPER. Wallpaper can be freshened by being cleaned with a ball of dough. A few cups of flour mixed with water, kneaded, and rolled down the wall in long strokes from top to bottom, has a wonderfully reviving effect. When paper needs patching, do not cut a nice straight piece for repairs; if the patch has uneven edges and is carefully pasted on it will hardly show. The home paperer, or who wants to re-paper a room entirely, should avoid a cheap paper, and should choose a pattern that is easy to match at the joints. RENEWING PAINTWORK. Shabby paintwork can also be renewed. Wash the woodwork thoroughly; when quite dry apply a thin coat of "flat" paint, and when that is dry apply a coat of enamel paint. Do not use too great a brush; use a proper painter's brush, and work with broad downward strokes—always with not too much paint on the brush. Most bought paints are better with a little turpentine stirred into the tin. THE GAS FITTINGS. When cleaning brass gas or electric light fittings, never use a metal polish, as this spoils the lacquer. If they are very dirty, wash with weak vinegar and water; rub dry with a soft duster, and polish with a dry leather. If brass fittings are rubbed occasionally with a soft duster slightly moistened with salad oil, and then with a dry duster, no further cleaning will be necessary, and they will always keep bright.

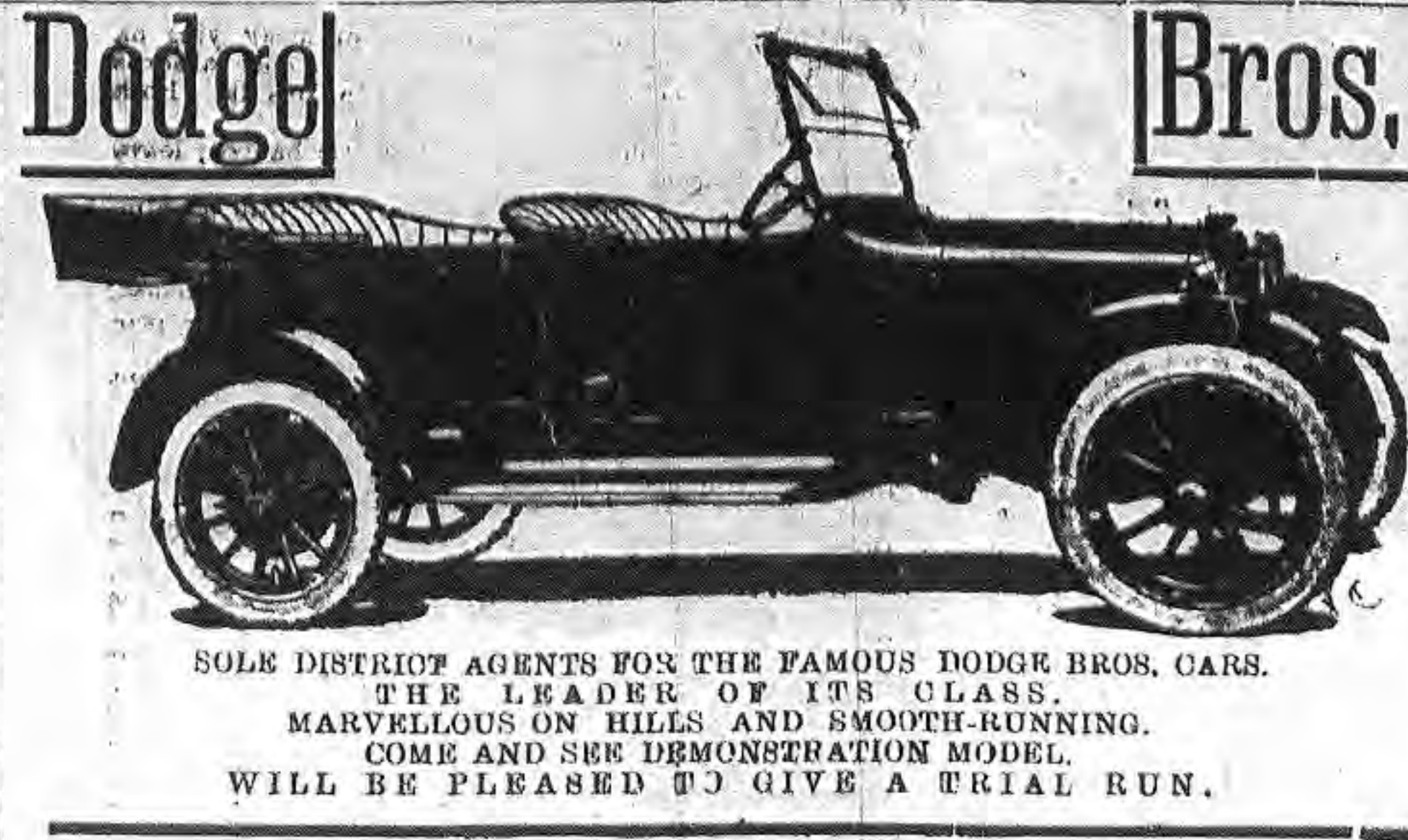
