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



WAR ON POACHERS.

This statement was contained in a circular letter from the Director of Fisheries, Dublin, to the various District Councils, signed by Mr. Sean Ebleigh, Director of Fisheries, which was read at a meeting of the South Dublin Rural District Council.

THE RUSSIAN FAMINE.

Touching Appeal for Funds. The Russian Famine Relief Committee, Fishmongers Hall, is appealing for funds from the public for aid for the millions of Russian people suffering so acutely in that country. The appalling conditions prevailing in Russia are fully explained in the Appeal which is in the following terms.

FUEL AND BLANKET FUND.

The annual meeting of the Limerick Fuel and Blanket Fund was held on Thursday in the Town Hall. The Bishop, Most Rev. Dr. Hallinan, presided. Also present—Very Rev. Canon O'Driscoll, P.P., V.P., Rev. Fr. Conroy, Mr. J. J. Deane, Adm., Mr. J. Q. Quinn, Mr. J. H. Roche, Mr. J. P. Dwyer, and Mr. J. R. Dunne, Hon. Secretary.

The Bishop said as they were aware the object of the Fund was to provide coal and clothing for the city poor during the winter months. It was a most praiseworthy object, and he need not tell them that it was one very near to his heart. He had no doubt that the citizens of Limerick would do all in their power to make the collection the success it deserved.

CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS.

Special Bookings to Ireland. "The Times," in giving particulars of the railway excursions which are being arranged for the Christmas holidays, has stated that the Limerick branch will be the most attractive of Irish excursions, which have been in vogue since before the war.

NO CHEAPER BEER YET.

The fact that brewery employees in some parts of the country have decided to accept reduced wages does not mean cheaper beer, says Diarist in the "Evening Standard." The effect of any wage reduction will be to reduce the price of beer by a penny on the half-pint and a penny on the pint.

NEXT GERMAN PAYMENT.

Conference of Experts. Dr. Rybczak, former German Minister of Reconstruction, has arrived in London with his private secretary. His arrival coincides with the return from Berlin of Lord Abinger, British ambassador, and Sir John Bradbury, British head of the Reparations Commission.

CANADIAN CATTLE.

Attitude of the Government. "An extremely doubtful whether the Government will change its settled policy on the matter for the simple reason that it has not been shown conclusively that the British farmer can be helped by buying Canadian cattle in preference to Irish or British stock cattle. Should the Government decide to maintain the embargo it will, no doubt, be guided more by this consideration than by any apprehension of the introduction of disease."

COUNTY LIMERICK FARMERS' ASSOCIATION.

The Dairying Industry. A very large and special meeting of the County Limerick Farmers' Association was held at the Hotel Limerick on Saturday, 28th ult. Mr. J. J. Ryan, Killybegs, presided. The future of the dairying industry in the County Limerick was very fully discussed. It was pointed out that the "lighting strikes" were absolutely detrimental to successful dairying. Within the past few years creameries had to be closed down, milk cows were left unattended and the milk was sold at a very low price. The production of milk resulted. As the matter stood, the dairying industry in County Limerick would have to be abandoned, and a large number of the farmers would be ruined. It was a very tender one, and required special care to make it successful. The contract system of labour in County Limerick has on the whole worked well, excepting in the case of the big farms, where the system was not being put to the thorough test of the cows. In the future, production has been stopped in the creameries, and in the latter the milk is being sold at a very low price. It is the duty of the farmer and his family to have no wage when all his obligations have been discharged. This is a serious national question for the future of Ireland. It was suggested that the farmers of the county should make early action for the coming year, and also combine action in every department of their business. If not they could not be successful in their work. The speaker of many farmers to the organization was criticized. It was stated that the farmer outside the organization was untrue to himself, his family, his fellow-farmer, and the nation. It was noted that the young farmer who has not increased his interest in the work of organization, in his work on the farm, and a broader outlook for the future.

HARDING PLAN.

To be Discussed by Conference. Washington, Nov. 30. President Harding's suggestion that a conference of nations be called annually, is expected to become the subject of formal discussion by the present conference after the dinner and the Eastern question are settled. The President hopes a serious effort will be made for an agreement for future meetings. As a result of foreign comment, the administration has also decided there is no intention that any association, resulting from the present conference, should become an undermining agency against the League of Nations. The President expects that some action with regard to the association will be proposed in the present conference, and if not, he will be greatly disappointed.

Italian Relief.

Rome, Monday—At a meeting here today, attended by various Ministers and Italian delegates, the International Conference on the Russian famine relief was discussed. The Italian Government has decided to contribute to the relief of the famine areas in Russia. It was decided to despatch medicines, disinfectants and food to be distributed by the Red Cross to districts worst affected by the famine. Special measures will be taken for the relief of children. The Italian delegates will have their base at a Black Sea port—Batum.

It was decided that every organized worker throughout the civilized world is to be today enjoying, and not allow themselves to be brought back to pre-war slavery by Mr. Carleton's award."

There was a large attendance of members at the annual meeting of Cahredavin Courseing Club on Tuesday night. Resolutions were made by the deaths of Mr. J. F. Barry, Mr. J. F. Halvey, and Mr. M. Gleeson, which took a deep interest in the Club. It was decided to hold a three sixteen-day courseing meeting on the 27th inst. A vote of thanks was tendered to Mr. J. McNamee, Shelburne, for giving his lands for the courseing meeting, and also to Mr. M. Graham for placing his lands at the Club's disposal for future meetings.

ARMENIAN REFUGEES AT ALEXANDRIA.

Alexandria, Thursday—Armenian refugees from Cilicia who have arrived here on a French steamer, have been refused permission to land. They refuse to continue the voyage, and have threatened the crew with draws revolvers.
