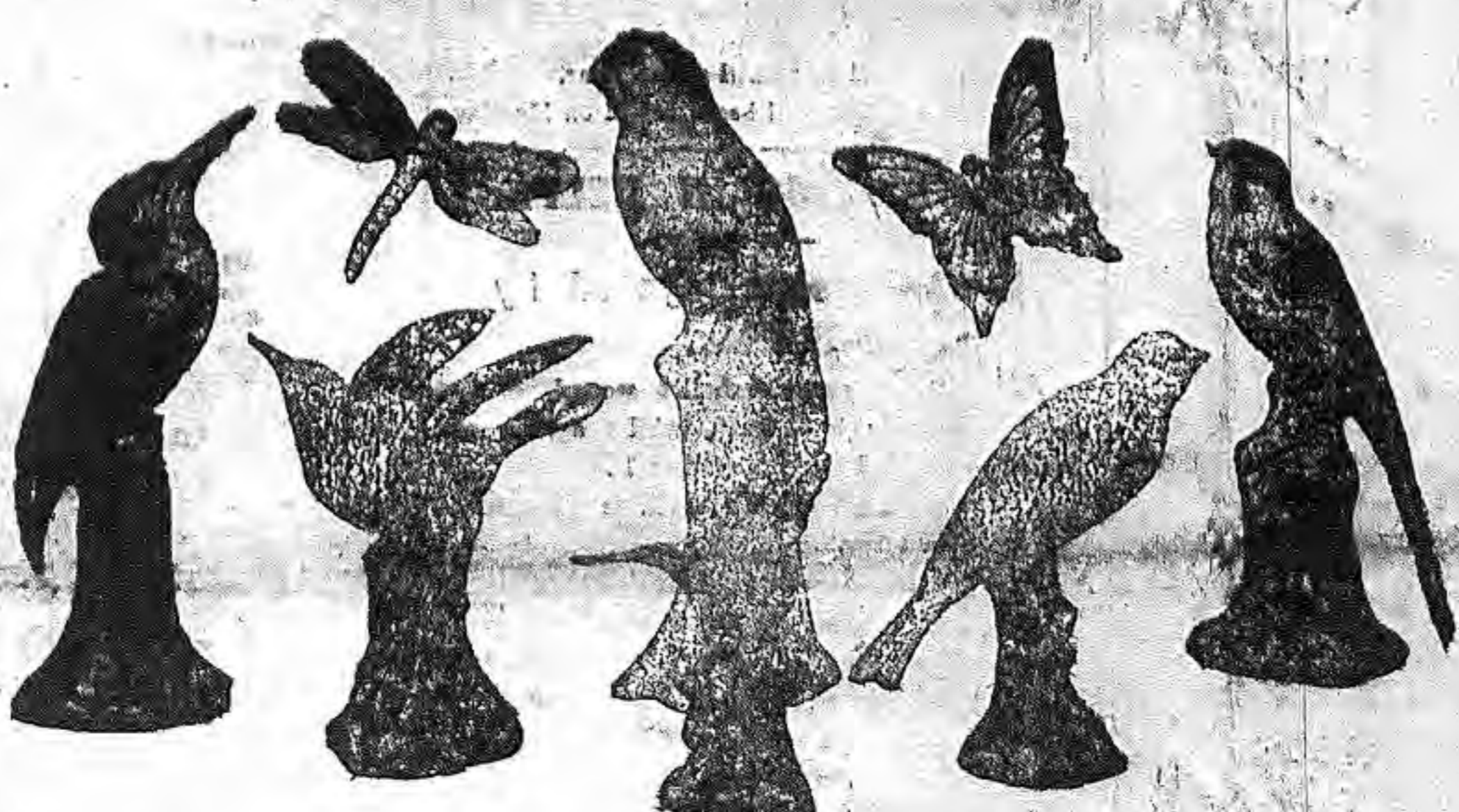

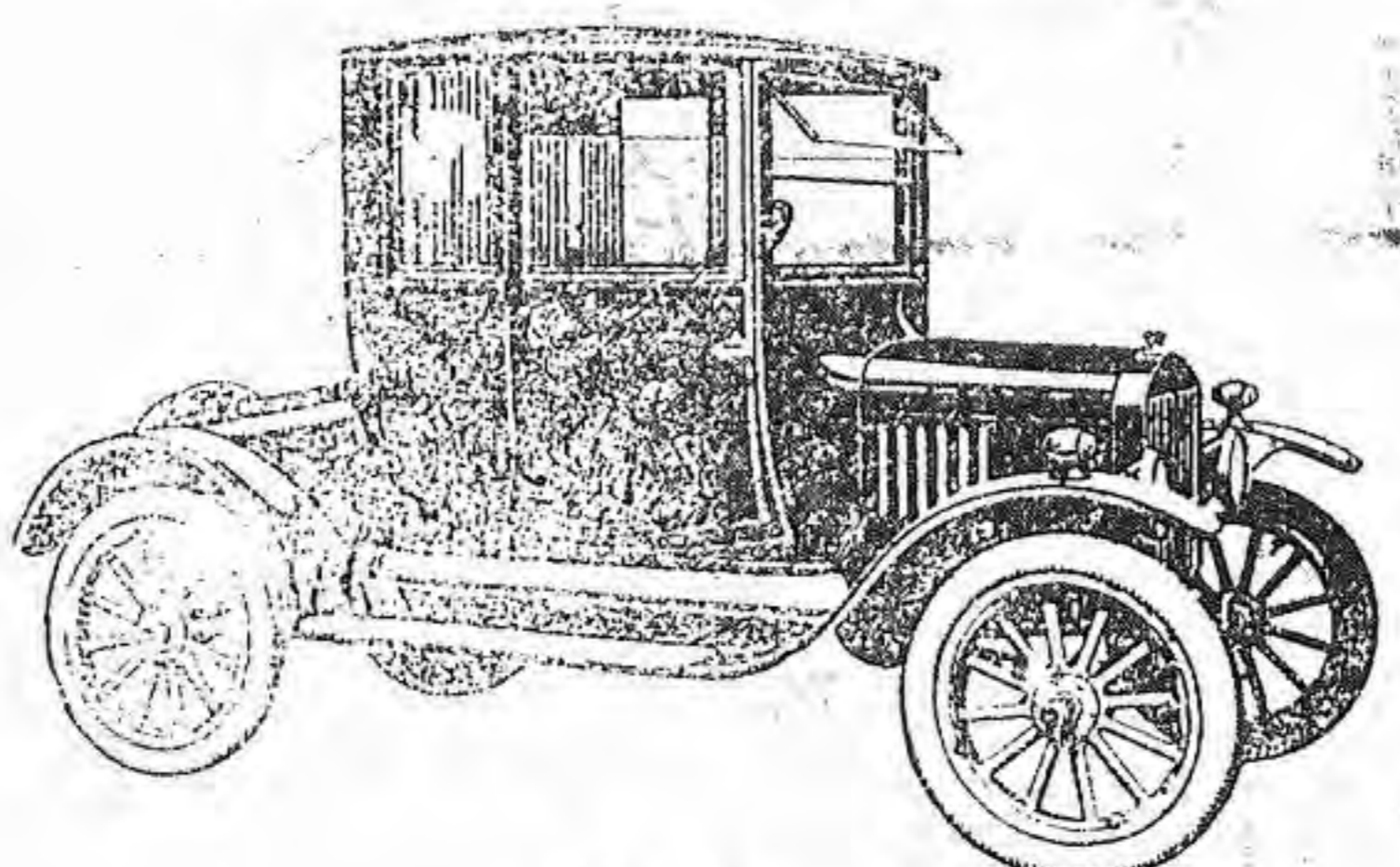

GERMANY AND REPARATIONS. Specific Information Required. COUNTY LIMERICK FARMERS' ASSOCIATION.

Labour Trouble in East Limerick.

A meeting of the Executive County Limerick Farmers' Association was held at Garry's Hotel, Limerick, on the 3rd inst. Mr P K Hogan presided. The following delegates, representing their branches, attended—Messrs J. Higgins, John Barry, A MoNa nara, Minister; S Walsh, D O'Connell, Denis Power, J Quinn, M Walsh, R O'Sullivan, P Foley, Donoughmore; J Butler, J Nason, Monaghan, J O'Sullivan, Fitzmaurice; Thomas Dandon, T Scallan, P Heffernan, E O'Sullivan, Patrickwell; P W Clery, M Clery, G Hartigan, Bulghaden; J M Clery, Kilmallock; P Dunworth, O'Leary; S Madden, John Kirby, P Minahan, Kneekes, G Kirby, Patrickwell; J P Mooney, M. Ann; J O'Shaughnessy, A T Laffan, J. O'Shaughnessy, D S O'Connell, O'Connell; J O'Grady, T McCarthy, M Halpin, P Hickey (Central), J McCarthy, M Walsh, Hickey, J. O'Connell, J. D. Farrell, Ballinacorney; E Hayes, do, etc.

Many delegates present did not record their names. The Chairman, in addressing the meeting, said the time had arrived for practical work in connection with their Association in the matter relating to farming, but especially dairying (farming), which was so important to the County Limerick. As a first step in this connection, it was pointed out by the delegates from those districts that two of their members had been closed owing to the action of the workers. A picket of men, it was stated, entered a farmer's house, broke a hand milk separator, and assaulted his wife.

A highly toxic industry like the dairying industry cannot be carried on under such conditions of this nature. Means must be devised for persons who are being unfairly treated, whereby a serious loss of food production is sustained by the nation in general, and one that cannot be borne by individual farmers, who are liable to depression. It is to be hoped that the National Government will institute a strict inquiry into the causes that have led up to these serious consequences, and that they will be met by a very representative State Committee was appointed to inaugurate a fund, so that individual farmers would not suffer serious loss in resisting interference with their business, and which would eventually lead to the abandonment of dairying in the country. The dairying industry gives good employment, and the rural workers are in a serious plight if the industry is broken up. The strike weapon interferes materially with the progress of any industry, but it is absolutely fatal to dairying.

With regard to the resolution proposed and adopted at last meeting re rates, the Organiser was directed to request the County Council to maintain the same. The Organiser stated that a promise had been given on behalf of the County Council that before the next rate is struck the proposed rate will be before the meeting of the County Council, and that the whole question can be fully discussed.

BALLINGARRY BRANCH. A successful meeting of this Branch was held in the Courthouse, Ballingarry, on the 4th inst. Mr Thomas Reidy, Co. Org., presided. The Chairman, in the course of his address, pointed out the necessity of union amongst their body. He could not understand how the farmers were so slow in organisation. They would be organised when it was too late, and when they were compelled to do so. That meeting was by no means as large as it should be. It was unfair on the part of their brother farmers to leave all the work on the shoulders of 15 or 20 men. All should take an interest in it.

The Organiser, in the course of his remarks, complimented Mr Reidy on his practical address. He would now be perfectly content with the organisation. The time had now gone by for words. In future it must be action. Every farmer must feel within himself the necessity of organisation. When the foreign producer gets the market in the centre of our attention, the Irish producer must look on and never asked the reason why. The Irish farmer must never command the value of his labour until he produces raw material in manufacture in Ireland in this country. It is a word that can only be done by organization and co-operation.

MONALEEN BRANCH. A meeting of this branch was held in the National School, Monaleen, on Tuesday evening, 6th inst. Mr B. Laffan, V.P. L.F.A., presided. There was a good attendance of the representative farmers of the district. The Chairman, in his address, pointed out that they all now felt the need of organisation. They had passed through troubled times, and their organisation in the country was in a state of want of cohesion owing to this cause, but now and in the future their branches should be organized, so as to embrace every farmer in the county. Their interests were so important that it had an essential bearing on the prosperity of the county. If the farmers wanted their business properly attended to they must not treat to outsiders. They must depend on the members of their own branch. He would renew the word, and he hoped their Organiser, with his experience now acquired, would succeed in galvanizing the branches into new vigour. The Farmers' Union should take a deeper interest in the public expenditure of their money. They should ask questions of their representatives. They should not be shy in offering suggestions at their branch or executive meetings. The Limerick County Council would always welcome suggestions from the farmers' Union, and would be very pleased to give them any information as to the method of spending their money. There was no doubt this was a disastrous year to the whole farming community. Their farms were held up for a long period, and their crops were damaged when the ban on the fair was removed. In the future everything must be done by way of retrenchment in public expenditure. The direct labour scheme was a mistake, and it cost over £100,000 per annum to the county. The branches of the Farmers' Union throughout the county could discuss this outlay, offer suggestions, and in a general way they would assist their public representatives.

Mr Walsh, organiser, addressed the meeting on the needs of organisation, and paid a high compliment to the members of the Co. Association—Messrs Laffan, T. Mooney (General Treasurer), J. Butler, J. McCormack, etc. The Chairman was asked several pointed questions re the very high rates in the county, and he answered them in that kind style characteristic of the practical and useful public man.

FRENCH BUDGET. Drastic Economy. Paris, Thursday.—The Budget has been balanced by drastic economy, and the dismissal of fifty thousand officials, and a total of 315 million francs being met. The Chamber adopted the Budget after an all-night sitting.

RECENT BOMBAY DISTURBANCES. Big Casualty List. Bombay, Wednesday.—The Bombay Government has issued a statement that in the November disturbances two Europeans and two Parsis were killed, and three Europeans and a number of Parsis injured. Fifty-three rioters were killed, and 298 wounded. 245 arrests were made.

CHRISTMAS PARCELS. The London and North-Western Railway Company have made complete arrangements for the collection and quick transit and prompt delivery of Christmas parcels in all the principal towns on their system over all parts of Wales and Scotland. Special "parcel" trains will be run, and through vans will also be attached to the principal passenger trains for the accommodation of the traffic, and additional delivery and collection services by parcel vans and carts will be in operation during Christmas and the preceding weeks. Senders are advised that, as an extra precaution, a duplicate address list should be enclosed in each parcel, so that the name and address of the consignee may be ascertained in the event of the outside address becoming detached or defaced.
