

DIGESTIBILITY OF RGGS.

Raw white of egg leaves the stomach much sooner than any other egg product: the raw yolk requires much longer. Hard-boiled eggs require a few minutes longer for gastrio digestion than soft boiled eggs; scrambled eggs require a little longer still. Eggs fried in excess of fat remain in the stomach only a little longer than boiled eggs. The popular belief that fried or moderately greasy foods give the stomach suppreciably more trouble was not substantiated by these experiments. Posched, stirred, and scrambled eggs were found to be the most readily digested forms of eggs. So says the Journal of the American Medical Association.
