PURPLE DYE FROM SHELLFISH. The process is very simple. On picking up the shell from the beach or detaching it from a-houlder, the gatherer blows her breath into it, whereupon a few drops of a granish liquor once out. This Equor is collected in a class-shell, and after a sufficient quantity has been collected the thread is passed through it, very soon assuming on exposure to the sunlight a beautiful purple colour, which is absolutely fast after it has turned purple. It is thought possible that the dye turns fast only on exposure. to the air, and that the liquor could be preparved by keeping the air away from it.

The English Mercurie, published by "Authoritie," was inst printed at Loudon, by her Highness' printer, 1688. Its mission was to contradict false reports, and although it is preserved in she British Museum, this newspaper is said by one authority to be a forgery of the eighteenth century. No genuine newspaper, it is added, has been preserved of the sixteenth century, excepting for some pamphlets under the title of "Newes from Spaine."




