

County Council of Limerick
Bovine Tuberculosis (Ireland) Act of 1914.

NOTICE.
An Order of the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, dated 18th December, 1919, brings into operation, as from 1st January, 1920, under the above title, the Regulations (Ireland) Order of 1914, which was suspended (save as regards one provision) from 31st August, 1915. Under the Order every person having in his possession or under his charge
(i) any cow which is or appears to be suffering from tuberculosis of the udder, indurated udder, or other chronic disease of the udder or
(ii) any bovine animal which is or appears to be suffering from tuberculosis due to tuberculosis of the udder, or
(iii) any bovine animal which is suffering from a chronic cough and showing definite clinical signs of tuberculosis is required to notify the Veterinary Inspector for the district of the fact without delay, and to keep the animal isolated from other animals as far as practicable (Article 10) until the animal is slaughtered, or the permission of the Local Authority for its removal is obtained. It is also required, if the animal is a cow, to take certain precautions with regard to milk and milk vessels (Article 9) by order.

The New Church of St. Munchin
AN APPEAL
ON Sunday, January 24th of this year, the Feast of St. Munchin, the Foundation Stone of a New Church for the Parish of St. Munchin was laid by the Most Rev the Lord Bishop of this Diocese.
For more than forty years the people of St. Munchin's Parish have felt the want of a New Church. The last four Parish Priests of St. Munchin's and the two last Bishops of the Diocese felt and acknowledged the necessity of a New Church, and each took steps towards that end.
It remained, however, for our present illustrious Bishop to set the work going. Indeed, it was with joy and thanksgiving they saw the foundation stone laid.
But, although the parishioners are contributing generously towards the cost of the church, and will continue to do so, yet the sum of £50,000, which is the cost of the church, modest indeed as it is, will cost, in too much foreign parish to contribute within a reasonable time, especially as there was not a fourth of that sum on hand to start with.
We, therefore, on behalf of the people of St. Munchin's Parish, appeal to our fellow-citizens, to all labour organizations, and to the industrial and commercial firms of our city, to help us to build this church in honour of St. Munchin, one of Ireland's premier saints, the patron of the parish of the city and of the diocese.
