



POINTS IN PATATO CULTUE

WHAT EXPERIMENTS HAVE SHOWN

Last sesson an interesting experiment was carried out in Irsland with the object of illustrating the advantages of up-to-date methods of cultivating the potato crop. - The old method of growing potatoes consisted of saking the seed directly from the pit for planting in the spring, and of applying farmyard manure only to the crop. Experiments previously carried out had shown the benefits resulting from the individual operations of (a) sprouting seed in boxes before planting (b) using a suitable mixture of artificial manures (o) spraying the erop

Old and New Methods

In the test under notice these thise operations were combined and theted against the one, and on persons who have been recomolder and less intensive method. Where the | mended to mercy by a jary. stop was grown on the improved system, the seed was sproated, 20 tons farmyard manure and 6 swe standard missure of artificials (I owt salphais of amonia, & ows superphosphate, and I swt murlate of potash) were applied, and the erop was sprayed twice. Inder she older method of sultivation the seed was planted whole direct from the pit, 20 tons of farmyard manure only applied, and the crop was left. ausprayed. The varieties included in the experiment were Arran Chief, Champion, Irish

Queen, and Skerry Champion. Satisfactory Results

The average total increase in yield due to improved methods was 3 tons 3 cwt per statute sers, the increased yield of ealeable subers was 4 tons 2 cwt, and there was a marked reduction in she yield of diseased and small tubers amounting to 19 owt per statute acre. The value of the increased yield was sufficient to leave a substantial profit after defraying the expenditure incurred for artificial manures, sprousing the seed, and spraying the crop. Best Varieties of Potatoes

In experiments which were conducted in Ireland isst season for the purpose of comparing the cropping capacities of a number of leading varieties of postatoes, Loohar, with a total yield of 124 tone per statute acre, headed the list, and was followed in order by Arran Victory with 10% tons; Up to Date, 10 tone; Arran Chief, 10 wons, and Champton, 92 sons. Great Scot and British Queen were tessed as mid-season varieties; the former gave a yield of 10 tons, and the latter 94 tons per statute acre. Lochar is very resistant to ordinary blight, but its cooking quality Is not good. Where, however, potatoes are grown for feeding to livestock and poultry, and not for sable use, Lochar should be given a trial. The proportion of 'chase' or small pots. toes as well as of diseased tubers in Arran Victory crops was low, and the cooking quality of this variety is good. The Department recommend that it should be tested by all who grow Champion, Irish Queen, and Arran Chief. for home consumption. In the districts where the Champion is grown extensively it is atill regarded as the best cocking potato-judging from the reports on cooking quality received. Compared wish the newer varieties it is, how. ever, as the returns show, a poor cropper.

Experiments Regarding Manures

Last season a number of experiments were sarried out under the anspices of the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of comparing (a) the relative values of seaweed an farmyard manure ; (b) the most suitable artificial fertilisers to use in conjunction with seaweed. In these experiments it was found that seaward produced a slightly higher ave rage yield of posatoes than farmyard manurea result at variance with the experience of the two years 1914 15 when farmyard manure gave the better yield. The experiments further showed that the Department's standard mix ture of artificials-I owt sulphate of ammonia, 4 owt superphosphate, and 1 owt muriste of potash-ean safely be recommended for use along wish seaweed.

For Potatoes on Peaty Soils
