Cause for Disquiet

SERIOUS disquiet is naturally being caused in this country by the present agitation for the free admission of Canadian stone cattle into these islands.

THE arguments brought forward in favour of lifting the embargo are much more specious than convincing, and an examination of them shows that they are in the main either hollow and unsustainable.

THE Irish Department of Agriculture traverses this contention, and goes on to prove that the reverse, if anything, would be more likely to be the case.

THE Department properly explains, "a large proportion of other statements of the home food supply, which go with the dairying and mixed farming systems (of which cattle breeding is an essential part), such as butter, cheese, bacon, poultry, eggs, mutton, oatmeal, potatoes, wheat, and other products of mixed farming."

THE question of the threatened removal of the embargo, it will thus be seen, is not one exclusively for the Irish farmer. It concerns all consumers and all interests in Ireland as well, and the matter is one, therefore, that should engage the attention of all classes before it is too late.

A Special Royal Commission is to be held in the near future to go into the whole question at issue and representatives of various Irish interests opposed to the admission of Canadian cattle are to present their case before it.

THE matter, therefore, that is between now and the sitting of the Commission the public opinion of Ireland would make itself fully heard on the matter so that the strongest and most convincing case possible be made against a step that would spell disaster for Ireland in more ways, probably than can at present be adequately realised.
