



PRATICAL and important action, we are glad to see, has been taken in Limerick with a view to the amicable arrangement of rent disputes

A meeting representative of landlords and tenants was held in the Chamber of Commerc on Wednesday last, when machinery for that iaudable and nescessiy purpose was set up.

Dr W Fogarty presided, and a Committee somewhat on the lines of the Limerick Conciliation Board was formed to effect settle

ments, if possible, where disputes arise. It was arranged, as the report we publish in our news columns this evening points out, to hold the meetings on Thursday in each week, and it is sequired that particulars of all cases to be inquired into should be lodged not later than the pravious Monday with the Honorary Secretary, Mr & Scallan, Leamy's School.

The action taken is a timely one, and we trust it will be the means of preventing much hardship and annoyance to tenants and keeping harmonious the relations between them selves and their landlords.

The existence of such a body as is now set up should be to the mutual advantage of both parties, because it may reasonably be expected to hold the scales evenly between the two esta of interests conserned.

Sweet reasonablence on both sides to any dispute can, in mearly all cases, do an enormous amount in gesting over difficulties and smooth log out differences, and that general rule and a better owned by Martin Mulvey. He holds, too, in the case of disputes between the owners and occupiers of house property.

What the Limerick Conciliation Board has to its credit in the matter of preventing strikes and doing justice between workers and employers gives ground for high hopes of equally good results from another body formed on similar lines.

It was rather fitting-and a good augury, too, let us hope-that Dr Fogarty, one of the two Chairmen of the Consiliation Board, presided at the meeting on Wednesday. He has had in ner knowledge of the working and use fainess of the Constitution Board, and his views as regards the stillty of conference and conciliation in cases arising between landlord and tenant were bound to be of practical

This evening we publish the announcement that an eviction of seven tenants arranged to be carried out in the city to day was at the No tees charged. THE STANDARD PRIVATE last moment adjourned until Tuesday for the purpose of trying to find a way out of the dispute, the existence and circumstances of which are in themselves a striking illustration of the need for some machinery like that now set up for the bringing about of amicable arrangements in such esses.
