Work of Replanting

The Irish Forestry Society held its annual general meeting to the College of Science, Dublin, Sir Thomas Grattan Esmonde, Bart, President, in the chair. The President expressed a hope that in the near future the reafforesting of Ireland would

progress as they all desired, for the country was emisently adapted to it. Mr A O Forbes, O B E, delivered an address on forestry. He said that the growing demand and increase in the searcity of timber during 1916 led to a sub-committee of the Reconstruction Committee being appointed to inquire into remedial messures. As a result, a Forestry Act was passed in 1919, and the Commission which followed took over the work carried on previously by the Agricultural

Boards of England and Scotland and the Irish Department of Agriculture. Over 25,000 acres had been acquired in freiand for reafforestry, of which 15,000 acres were cecured between 1908 and 1919 by the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction. Progress made in planting was being rapidly accelerated. If the progress was maletained is should in the course of a few years arrest the steady dimination of Irish woods. which had been going on for half a century.
