Maynooth Mission to China.

THE Maynooth Mission to China is a Society of priests and students which, with the approbation and encouragement of the Holy See and of our Bishops, has devoted itself to the conversion of China.

We have established in Ireland two Colleges for the education of students who have given their lives to this work. Last year our first band of 16 priests arrived in China, where they have begun the work committed to us by the Holy See of converting FIVE MILLIONS OF PAGANS. They have only a few houses for their own accommodation; they have only nine poor chapels and an extremely small number of schools. They have appealed to us now very urgently for extensive and generous financial aid to enable them to provide a number of houses for themselves, chapels for their people, and schools for the hundreds of thousands of children who are clamouring for Christian education.

NEXT SEPTEMBER ELEVEN PRIESTS WILL LEAVE US FOR THE SAME DISTRICT in China. The expenses of their voyage to China and of their outfits will be very great. The cost of finding houses, chapels and schools for them in China will be enormous.

IN AUGUST FOUR TEACHING BROTHERS will leave to found a good High School in our district. This in itself, will involve great expenditure. I appeal, then, urgently and earnestly, to our Catholic people to give us, IMMEDIATELY, generous assistance to meet all these demands at home and in China. Scholarships for Girls.

THE Trustees of above Endowment invite applications for Two Scholarships for Girls of Twenty-four Pounds (£24) each, tenable at District School, or Domestic Economy, which they offer by competition to girls resident in the County of Limerick.

Headline from France

FRANCE may be a poor model for Ireland in many respects, but in one thing, at least, it has set a headline that this country could not do better than imitate.

When "the eldest daughter of the Church" was in national trouble in 1870 a request was made to the French people to erect in Paris a sanctuary to the Sacred Heart in order to obtain assistance for the Pope and the salvation of France.

In 1873, according to the National Assembly passed a law authorizing the carrying out of this design, and forthwith was begun the erection of the superb Basilica which now crowns the heights of Montmartre—a monument of devotion and gratitude to the Great Master of all nations and peoples, and of everlasting glory to France itself.

Recalling these things in a letter in the June issue of the "Irish Messenger," a correspondent makes the interesting suggestion that Ireland should take similar steps with a view to obtaining Divine assistance in the "Gosh-amsane of tribulation" through which the island is passing at present.

This matter has been receiving considerable attention of late, and in our humble opinion it would be a glorious thing if the Irish people as a whole joined to their petitions to the Sacred Heart for deliverance the practical life of definite thanksgiving in advance in the shape of an immediate scheme for the erection of a National Basilica like that set up with a similar object in France.

"When we need or desire anything very much," truly remarks the "Messenger" correspondent, "we are ready to promise almost any price for it beforehand, whereas, if we merely receive it gratis, in answer to a simple petition, we are often like the nuns who do not return to give thanks after the favour has been granted."

Ireland was never, perhaps, more in need of Divine help than she is at this momentous crisis in her history and her people, accordingly, could do nothing better than to not only "storm heaven" but to add to their prayers a solemn pledge to carry out some special act of devotional thanksgiving in token of gratitude for deliverance from their trial.

The correspondent of the "Messenger," after bringing out these points, says: "I would suggest that a solemn promise (somewhat on the lines of that just alluded to) be made on the part of the Irish nation at home and abroad, to build a Basilica in gratitude to the Sacred Heart, should a favourable answer to our prayers for Ireland be granted in our present distress. I have no doubts the response to this proposal—which would appeal to every noble and generous impulse in us, and to our Celtic imagination—would surpass all expectations. The details of the scheme would be easy, if the general plan were once adopted. Our venerable hierarchy could arrange to have the solemn promise made; while every city, town and village could guarantee, through its chosen representatives, clerical and lay, the raising of the necessary funds for the enterprise. America has shown us how quickly this can be done, by the system of guaranteeing subscriptions."

The Editor of the "Messenger" strongly commends this very interesting proposal to the careful consideration of his readers and expresses the conviction that such a promise made by the people of Ireland through their representatives accompanied by a guarantee of the necessary funds would have a powerful influence in bringing about a happy solution of Ireland's present difficulties.

Moreover, adds the editorial footnote to the "Messenger" letter, "just as Montmartre stands as an everlasting memorial of the gratitude of France for being saved from destruction in 1870, so, too, a great Basilica in honour of the Sacred Heart, erected by the Irish people at home and abroad, with side chapels in honour of the Blessed Virgin, Blessed Oliver Plunkett, and the Irish Saints, would be a standing memorial for all time of the gratitude of Ireland for the attainment of the long cherished wish and hope of the Irish nation."

We regard the suggestions made by the correspondent of the "Messenger" and backed up by the Editor of this valuable Irish publication as eminently sound and commendable, and we sincerely trust that they will receive in Limerick and elsewhere throughout Ireland the sympathetic and practical consideration they deserve.

BURNINGS IN SCARIFF
Workhouse, Post Office and Mansions Destroyed

News received Limerick this morning that the Scariff Workhouse was set fire to last night, and was enveloped in the conflagration this morning. Almost at the same time, it is said, the Post Office there was also destroyed by fire. A mansion belonging to Mr. Hibbert, an Englishman, situated between Scariff and Mount Shannon, and an unoccupied residence known as Drawnstown in the same district, were also burned down.

LIMERICK MAN REPRIVED CASE OF EDWARD PUNCH Death Sentence Commuted Claim for £50 Damages

The following telegram from the House of Commons was received in Limerick yesterday morning from Captain Redmond, M.P.:—"Have succeeded in getting reprieve for Punch."

The foregoing is in reference to the case of Edward Punch, Frederick Place, Limerick, who was convicted by a Grand Jury of the Court-martial at the New Barracks on the 21st inst. of leaving war and being in possession of firearms on the 23rd April last.

Since his conviction Punch has been in the County Prison.

Timothy Murphy, Pigeon's Lane, Limerick, was tried by the same court-martial as Punch and convicted, but, so far, no commutation of Murphy's sentence has been intimated.

The evidence for the prosecution showed that the accused were arrested in a house at Abbeey, near Killybegs, on the 23rd April, and two revolvers, which they denied any knowledge of, were found by Crown forces in the apartment in which they slept. The prisoners were identified by Crown witnesses as the men who were alleged, concerned in an attack on the 23rd April, on the 23rd April last.

The sentence on Punch has been commuted to penal servitude for life.

A copy of a letter from the Chief Secretary regarding the young man Edward Punch, of Limerick, who was sentenced to death, is published in the "Irish Messenger."

In view of all the circumstances of the case, the Commander in Chief has commuted the sentence, to one of penal servitude for life.

Major Redmond strongly pressed his appeal for a reprieve to the Home Office, and was able to place additional facts before the military authorities, which, no doubt, influenced them in their decision.

CITY PETTY SESSIONS
FINES IN CRUELTY CASES

At the City Petty Sessions to-day, before Colonel Williamson and Major Burke and Dr. O'Connell, a cruelty case was charged by Sergeant Hovatt with working a jenny suffering from scabs. Complainant stated that on 25th May he found the jenny in the street and was half an hour looking for the owner, who was trying to strike her, and was taken to the pound. The jenny was returned to the owner, who was fined £5.

Major Burke considered the amount excessive. Patrick Vaughan, Oranby, was charged by Inspector Linnane, S.P.O., with permitting a jenny to be worked in an unwholesome manner. Complainant stated that he found a jenny drawing milk to a creamery; the jenny, which was being driven by a youth of 14 years, had the appearance as if it had fallen many miles; underneath the animal a large red lumping sore, it was a bad case of cruelty. To Col. Williamson—The defendant did not appear; about 18 months ago he was a witness for the defence in a cruelty case.

Col. Williamson—Very well, the defendant is fined £10. We will put an end to these cruelty cases.

POLICE FIRED AT
Outside Kilmommon Barracks

A Dublin Castle report says:—At 10.30 pm on the 7th inst., several police constables were standing near the front of their barracks at Kilmommon, Newport district, (Tipperary), when they were fired at from long range about 30 shots were fired in all. INTERESTING MURDER CASE CONTINENTAL MARKETS FOR IRISH CATTLE

A meeting of the Executive of the County Limerick Farmers' Association, held at Garry's Hotel on Saturday, Mr. Denis O'Brien, M.P., Chairman, presiding.

The following resolution was proposed by Mr. O'Brien:—"That we, the Executive of the County Limerick Farmers' Association, hereby call on our National Executive to go into communication with the markets on the Continent for Irish cattle, and to see that the best possible prices are obtained for these cattle in English ports, owing to alleged outbreaks of foot and mouth disease, is ruinous to the industry."

It was pointed out that the losses sustained by the farmers of Limerick in this branch of their industry were enormous, and would eventually lead to the wiping out of the better industry, for which the county is so eminently suitable. It was stated that only one outbreak of foot and mouth disease had occurred in 25 1/2 years in England. From 1915 to 1920, inclusive, 3,871,757 cattle were exported to England, and 2,655,687 were exported to Scotland. During the same period, the total number of cattle in Scotland had been increased to 1,200,000.

The resolution was adopted unanimously.
