Maynooth Mission to China.

THE Maynooth Mission to China is a Society of priests and students which, with the approbation and encouragement of the Holy See and of our Bishops, has devoted itself to the conversion of China.
We have established in Ireland two Colleges for the education of students who have given their lives to this work. Last year our first band of 16 priests arrived in China, where they have begun the work committed to us by the Holy See of converting FIVE MILLIONS OF PAGANS. They have only a few houses for their own accommodation; they have only nine poor chapels and an extremely small number of schools. I appeal, then, urgently and earnestly, to our Catholic people to give us, IMMEDIATELY, generous assistance to meet all these demands at home and in China. These words convey the position of the Irish Bishops' Conference, as chosen by the Government—i.e. the British Government, based upon moral rights as defined by their Lordships, is recognised by the British Government there can be no peace."

SINK FEIN SUBMARINES

Reported Service Between America and Ireland

A Boston message from New York says:—"The New York Tribune" quotes Captain Shantley, Secretary of the New York Council for the Recognition of the Irish Republic, as stating that two submarines, flying the Irish flag, will be sent to Ireland to assist in the struggle for independence.

THE AGRICULTURE ACT

Government to Compound Liabilities

It was officially announced at the meeting of the National Farmers' Union in London on Wednesday that the Government has agreed to compound their liabilities under Part I of the Agriculture Act by the payment of 24 pence per acre in respect of this year's crop, and 48 pence per acre in respect of the year's wheat crop.

Advocate Voluntary Wage Committees

The National Farmers' Union as a special meeting in London on Wednesday passed the following resolution:—"That the Council of the National Farmers' Union agree to recommend to its country branches that, in view of the fact that the Government has decided to bring the Agriculture Wages Board, they should assist in the setting up of voluntary joint committees in the counties, and a central committee in London composed of the National Farmers' Union and of organized agricultural workers, to deal with questions affecting wages in the industry."

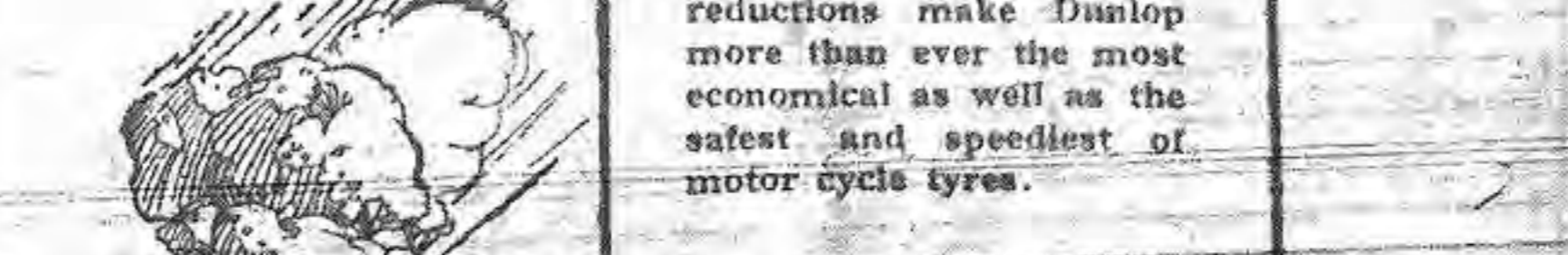
