COOKERY NOTES. Useful Hints and Recipes. Crab Pie. Fill shell with meat from crab, seasoned pepper, salt, parsley, and mixed with bread-crumbs. Dot over with butter and bake 1 hour. Macaroni a la Bretonne. Boil macaroni until in lengths. Have Bretonne sauce ready and let macaroni cook in it. Put in a dish with fried bread-crumbs on top, and make very hot in oven. To make the Bretonne sauce, chop large onions finely and fry in butter. Add good stock and season with salt and pepper.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS. Miso do not like the smell of peppermint, and a little oil of peppermint placed about the house will soon make them look for other quarters. Baking soda gives instant relief to a burn or scald. Applied either wet or dry to the burned part immediately the sense of relief is magical. To use up coal dust economically take a shovel and before placing it on a fire sprinkle it with a few drops of water. This causes it to burn well and brightly. A good way of preserving the odour of black stockings is to wash them with soap that is free from soda, and add a tablespoonful of vinegar to the last rinsing water.
