Mr Orolly explained in detail the methods of co-operation in which his Society had successfully sogaged.

In every branch of thefar ming industry co-operation was indispensable if the farmer was to hold his own in the future Unfortunately the importance of the industry is not sufficiently realised by carselves. Sufficient astention is not paid to organisation and propaganda. There is a very serious duty cast on the young farmers of the fiture. When the manule of responsibility fails on shem, shey muss rise to the occasion and not lead the lives of slaves as their ancestors did in the past. No patelde force will be allowed to fich from them, directly or indiracely, the value of their toil on their homesteade.

The following resolution was proposed by the Chairman and carried unanimensly :-" That the Herbertstown Branch of the County Lime. rick Farmers' Association hereby call on the members of the Board of Agriculture to convens a meeting at their partiest possible convenience to inquire into recent appointments made by the Department and the qualifications of those gentlemen who may have to do with the marketing of our Irich agriculture produce in the big centres of consumption."


