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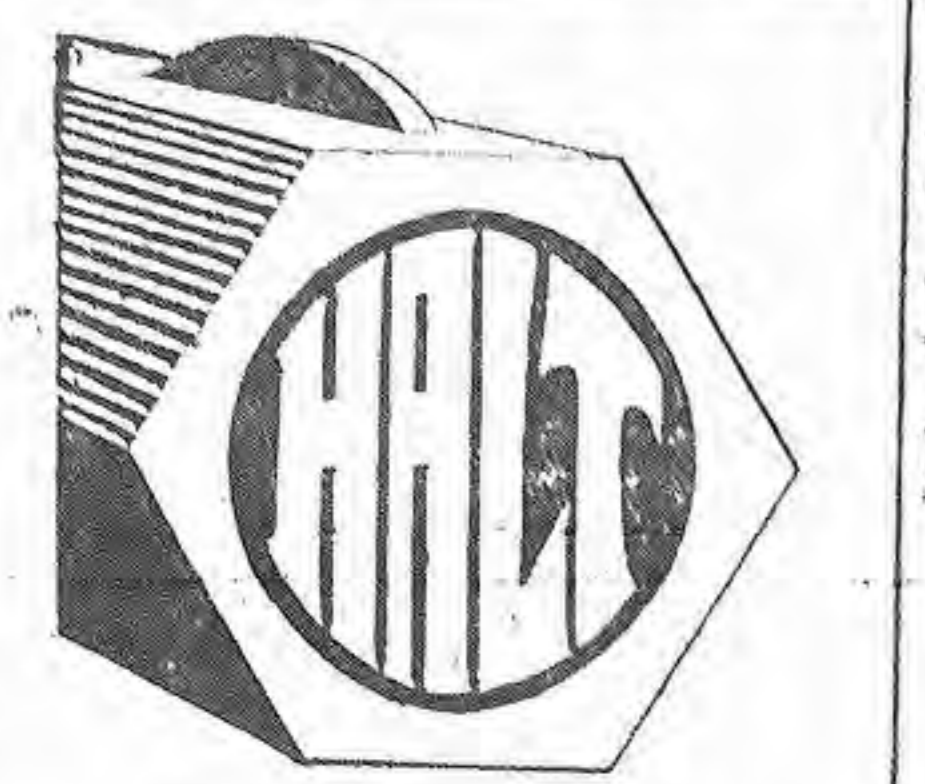

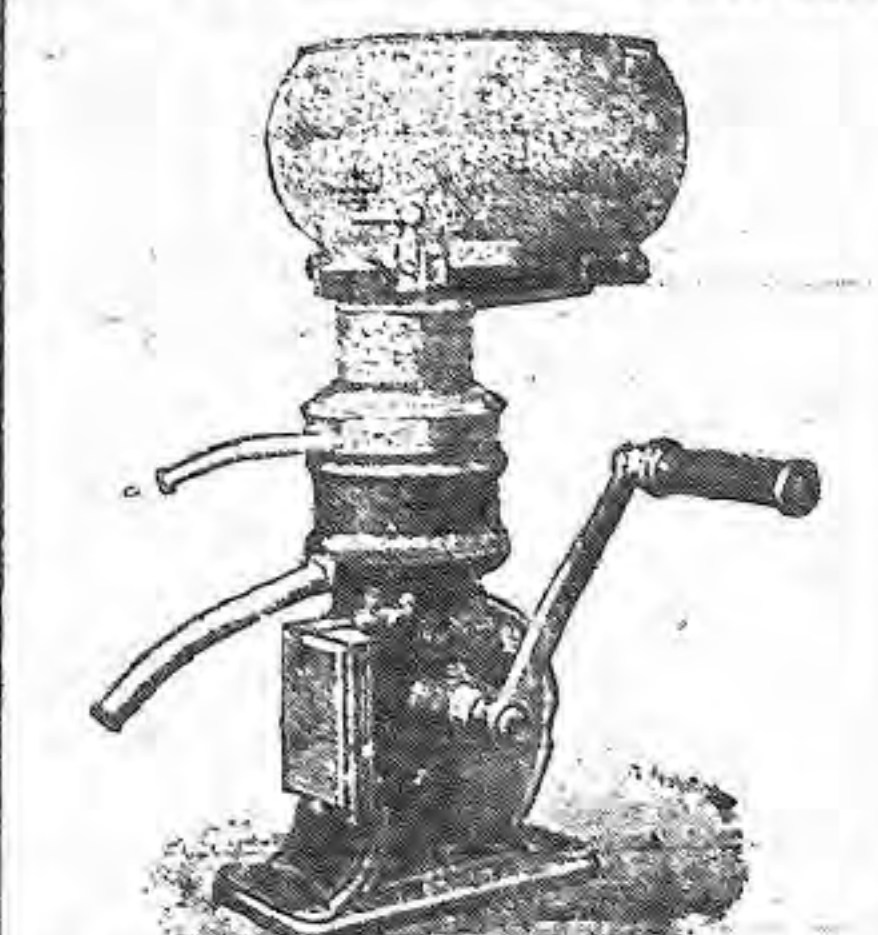

TRUCE IN THE SOUTH

Liaison Officers' Reports

Commandant Barry, F.R.A., Chief Liaison Officer for Munster and the adjoining Counties of Wexford and Kilkenny, stated on Saturday that among the complaints of branches of the truce received by him were the following: "The fair at Tulla, East Clare, was stopped by armed military and police on the 19th inst. They were placed on all roads leading to the fair green and town, and turned back all people driving cattle and sheep, as well as carts with bonfires. The soldiers were armed with rifles, and about 12 soldiers and two police were on each road, the police carrying revolvers. They remained in position until 1.30 p.m. "On Wednesday, the 20th inst, two lorries of enemy soldiers went from Fermoy in the Tallow direction. As soon as the news as far as Limerick was known, the authorities were on the alert, and the lorries were stopped at the bridge and drove the lorries through a field of mangrove, with the result that damage to the extent of £20 was done to the property of a farmer named Mr Barry, Garrymore. This matter was reported to General Cameron, and a claim for compensation for the above sum made."

THE WELSH TRAGEDY

Capital Charge Again

The coroner's inquiry into the death of the little Aberystwyth girl, Florence Lister, aged 11, concluded on Friday night, when the jury returned a verdict of wilful murder against the lad, Harold Jones. Only last month Jones was acquitted at Mallowathore of a charge of murdering a little girl named Freda Stewart. The boy's parents and his little sister, Florence, were present when the fatal words were uttered by the forerunner of the boy. The boy simply hung his head, but was very deeply impressed. "Oh, my God," exclaimed the mother, as she fell back, and was removed from the scene. "The boy's sister cried bitterly. Almost immediately after the coroner had committed him for trial, he was brought before a magistrate, and was formally remanded until Wednesday next, when the police court proceedings will be gone into.

CHARLEVILLE ACCIDENT

A serious accident took place at Charleville on Saturday night. Mr J. H. Thomas, an old comrade, had at last triumphed in regard to Ireland. There were those determined to Ireland, but the effort was unsuccessful; but if we returned to an Irish war, it would be ten times worse than before. He welcomed the Washington Conference. The American and British people repudiated the idea of war. The British went to Washington there would be no war. It was a year in his absence. He was the best of a political situation to allow that.

HEAD PORTER CHARGED

With Attempted Murder

Limerick Junction Shooting

At Tipperary, before Major Colley, R.M., John Fitzgerald, head porter at Limerick Junction Railway Station, was charged in custody with the attempted murder of Martin Larkin, railway porter, by discharging firearms at him and wounding him in the shoulder at Limerick Junction on the night of Sunday week.

Private Fitzgerald, D.I., R.I.C., prosecuted, and Mr James F. D'Arcy, solicitor, defended. The deposition of Michael Larkin, the injured man, taken at Tipperary Military Hospital, was to the effect that he met his brother Michael on arrival at Limerick Junction station on the Sunday night. They met Fitzgerald, who refused to return a salute from them, saying Michael was "bad company."

Witnesses asked him to withdraw the remark, but Fitzgerald ran away. Witness and Michael walked down the platform, and returned to their home they again met Fitzgerald who then said to Fitzgerald: "You are a bad fellow, you are a bad fellow, you are a bad fellow." Fitzgerald fired at a range of three or four yards, and witness was struck in the right shoulder. Michael helped witness to the head waiter's room. On the way down he met a priest running towards him.

Cross-examined by Mr D'Arcy—Witness didn't know that Michael has on a previous occasion been reported to the railway authorities by Fitzgerald; he didn't see Michael strike Fitzgerald and witness never struck or attempted to strike him; witness never possessed a revolver and never saw a revolver with Michael; he never had a row with Fitzgerald, and could give no reason as to why Fitzgerald fired at him.

Michael Larkin stated that Fitzgerald approached Martin in a fighting attitude on the platform; witness showed over and said they didn't want to fight; Fitzgerald ran away; they met him again at the south end of the platform, where he fired a revolver at Martin, who staggered and showed he had been shot, after which he went to Martin's room and reported the matter to the police barracks.

Cross-examined by Mr D'Arcy—Witness was reported to the railway authorities by Fitzgerald, but was not reprimanded; he denied that he was in company with two men named Hodnett and O'Connor about 8 o'clock the afternoon, but he saw the men at some distance away; Hodnett had a bucket and was walking after O'Connor; he saw Fitzgerald take a bucket out of Hodnett's hand; witness knew one man who was dismissed because of the efforts of the Vigilance Society in detecting pilfering at the station; witness was not aware that Fitzgerald was head of the Society.

Sergeant Ferris, R.I.C., Limerick Junction, stated that Fitzgerald reported at 11.40 a.m. at the barracks that he had been fired at; he said he had reported men for pilfering, and that the two Limerick men came before him and showed "Put them up!" and a shot was fired; witness detained Fitzgerald at the barracks, and on a subsequent search of Fitzgerald's lodgings, at which witness was present, Constable Humphries found on a spring mattress leaning up against the wall a long brass rod such as was used for cleaning revolvers.

Cross-examined by Mr D'Arcy—The cleaning rod was not covered, but it could not be seen from the ground; if one expected a search it would not be an ideal place to put it. Daniel McHigan, telegraph clerk at Limerick Junction, stated he was about 11.40 a.m. he heard a shot, and on coming out he saw Fitzgerald running down the railway; witness went after him and shouted "What's up," and Fitzgerald staggered and sped and said "I'm after being fired at"; witness asked him if it was in connection with the shot in the evening, and Fitzgerald said "Yes, I have been accused a couple of times"; they proceeded down the line for some distance, and witness volunteered to bring some keys from Fitzgerald to some of the men; he left Fitzgerald standing in a field near the line; Fitzgerald appeared to be frightened and white as he ran towards the barracks, and for that reason didn't want to take the direction to the barracks.

District Inspector Gilgally stated that on being arrested and cautioned Fitzgerald said—"I didn't shoot. There was a shot fired at me by Michael Hodnett or Martin Larkin—I couldn't say which. I was at the barracks about 11.15 p.m., outside the Post Office door by Michael and Martin Larkin, and I ran away. About 10 minutes afterwards I came back down the platform. Michael and Martin Larkin were on each side of me and shouted "Put your hands up." I was then fired at, and I jumped on to the railway. I thought they meant to kill me. A man at the station told me that Michael Larkin had reported at the police barracks that I shot Martin, and I then went to the barracks. I never used a firearm in my life, and I never reported Michael on several occasions in connection with railway work. To-day I caught him in company with two other men with a bucket alongside a wagon of porter. I am an active member of the Vigilance Society, and some men were dismissed last night for pilfering as a result of my work."

Fitzgerald was sent for trial to the Assizes and was admitted to bail.

IRISH BANK OFFICIALS

The Question of Pensions

Arbitrators' Award

Another step forward has been taken to put the position of Irish bank officials on a satisfactory basis. Following on the award of the arbitrators fixing minimum scales of salaries, which was made last year, we are informed, says the "Freeman," that the question of pensions has been disposed of by a further award made in pursuance of the agreement entered into in December, 1919, between the banks and the Irish Bank Officials' Association. The arbitrators in the present case were Mr. William T. Gresser, of Cork, for the banks, and Mr. Simon W. Madoff, D.L., of Dublin, for the Association. After the appointment of the arbitrators were settled by mutual agreement, and were adopted by the arbitrators and embodied in their award. Under the agreement pensions are to be granted to those officials whose right to a pension is established provided he has been in the service of a bank for fifteen years. He is then, if retired, entitled to 80-75ths of his salary, and 1-75th is added for every additional year of service until the maximum of two-thirds variable according to the pension list is reached. The pension shall be similar to the bonus on salaries. No official can be deprived of his pension except for specific causes which involve dishonesty or improper conduct. Officials have the right to retire on a pension of 65 years of age, or 45 years of age if they have served for 25 years. Mr. E. H. Doolan, for the Bank, and Mr. O. H. Deane, for the Association, were the arbitrators. The Royal Bank of Ireland, though not a party to the award, was understood to agree with the Association as to the award, and the officials. The award, we are informed, has given great satisfaction to the officials.
