Telling his old servant to follow him, he tried to rush down the church tower and ring the only bell there to alarm the villagers. The latter rushed out of their houses, half dressed and carrying pitchforks and sticks, while a few of them had guns as well. The masked man had been broken down by the noise and fell on his hands and knees, begging for mercy. The priest was able to keep the villagers as bay. Meanwhile the door of the priest's residence had been broken down and the masked man made his way to the tower. They fired several shots through the window, but they did not hit the priest. The Rev. 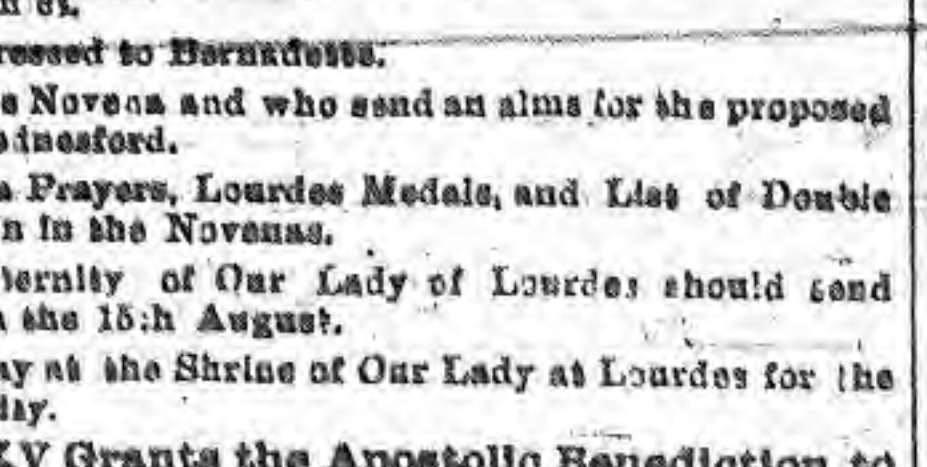

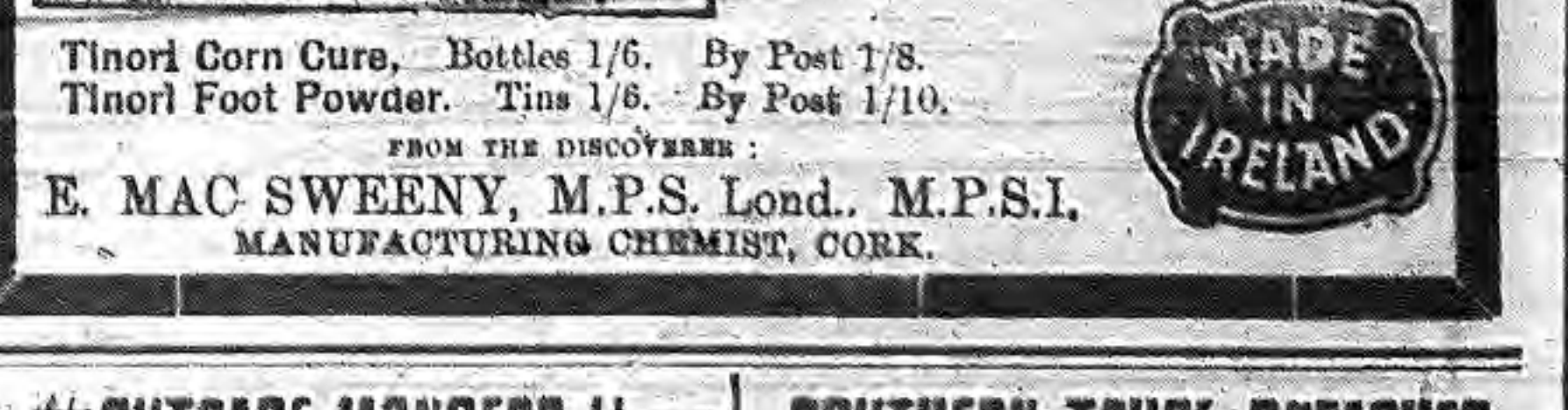
