DAIL'S ADVICE

TO IRISH FARMERS

Sow Grain Crops Now

The following official statement has been issued from the Department of Agriculture of the Day:—

"Farmers have suffered much loss through the drought, but even a drought has its own benefits. As a result of it we have an early harvest. All farmers should take full advantage of this early advance of the corn land to sow at least a proportion of their 1922 grain crops during the ensuing weeks.

"Varieties of wheat, oats and barley can be sown in the autumn, and again it is better to sow in the autumn than in the spring or summer.

"The best fire insurance policy a grain farmer can effect at the present time is to put his grain in the ground as an early date by way of a premium for next year's crop.

"Of winter wheat there is in Ireland a sufficient supply to feed the population for 8 weeks only.

As Memorial to Caruso

A Bunter message from New York says:—An eighteen foot candle that can be burned on every All Souls' Day for 5,000 years is being made here as a memorial to Enrico Caruso from the inmates of an orphan home to which the Metropolitan Opera has contributed 10,000 dollars a year for many years. It will be placed in the Church of the Madonna of Pompeii in Naples, Italy. It will be completed in 100 weeks and will weigh about 1,000 pounds. It is stated that the candle will burn continuously for thirteen years and seven months.

DOCK LIGHTING

New Device on Market

A new light-concentrating lamp for use in docking and stevedoring at night has been put on the market. The apparatus consists of a "flashlight projector" fitted with a Merck gas-filled lamp and mirror reflector, and is capable of projecting a powerful beam of light over a wide area. The device is attached to a portable mounting, so that the rays can be directed on to the side of the vessel, the quay or any particular spot desired. The General Company has ordered some of the projectors, which will be demonstrated at the forthcoming shipping exhibition.

Cutting Down Incomes

Great changes in wage and bonus will come into operation on Thursday (to-morrow) affecting millions of workers (writes the London correspondent of the "Economist"). The bonus paid to the higher officials in the Civil Service will be subject to a special reduction of 10 per cent in cases where basic salaries range from £501 to £799, and of 20 per cent on those from £800 to £999, and so on, the reduction increasing by 2 per cent for each additional £100. In the case of the Post Office the bonus paid to wage earners is in most cases more than the wage itself. The reduction of participating and shipbuilding workers have been notified to the "Economist". The bonus as from September 1, the Ministry of Munitions' new bonus of 12 per cent to the workers and 7 1/2 per cent to piece workers. Thousands of men are affected, and a questionnaire is proposed. Railwaymen's wages, too, are subject to adjustment in September, on the beginning of the year of about £5,000,000 in the full-time weekly wages of nearly 8,700,000 workpeople, while on the other side there has been an increase of only about £75,000,000 in the full-time weekly wages of about 300,000 workpeople. The outlook for the coming winter in this country is certainly gloomy so far as the workers are concerned.

SOUTH DERRY ELECTION

Colonel O'Connell (Unionist) was on Monday returned unopposed for South Derry in the Imperial Parliament. The vacancy was caused through the resignation of the Right Hon. D. S. Henry, K.C. to the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.
