If the enamel on a bath is cracked and much worn remove it by scraping and rubbing it off with a small hammer. Next soak and rub the bath with turpentine, to loosen the scales and thoroughly clean out all grit. Mix one part of boiled oil and four parts of turpentine, and paint this coat of this oil over the bath. When dry, coat over two or three coats of bath enamel, which can be bought in tin. Bath coat must be dry before applying the next.

SEQUEL TO ROBBERY
Three Men Taken to Unknown Destination
A correspondent writes: - Three young men in Tipperary have been arrested by Republican Volunteer police and taken to an unknown destination, as a sequel to the recent robbery of jewellery, table knives, etc., amounting to over £200 worth, from the residence of Mr. Sheehy, headmaster of the Abbey School. The theft took place when the headmaster and students were away on holidays. When Mr. Sheehy returned he found the front door secured by a chain on the inside, with the obvious purpose of preventing any person from entering while the ransacking operations were in progress. On entering by the back he found everything turned topsy-turvy in the house, and that there had been a robbery on an extensive scale.

Hospital Fair
The above was a large fair of stock cattle, with a good attendance of shippers, and a brisk demand for cattle in good condition, about 60 per cent changing hands. Springers and milch cows were a slow article, prices showing a downward tendency. Calves under six months old, £9 to £6. Store cattle - Over 6 and under 12 months, £10 to £13; one year old and under two years, £18 to £23. av. £20; 2nd class, £15 to £18, av. £16; two years old and under three, 1st class, £24 to £28, av. £26; 2nd class, £23 to £24, av. £23. Fat cattle ranged as follows from £28 to £33. Springers - Cows and heifers, £25 to £28 according to class; milch cows (down to 600) - 1st class, £30 to £40, av. £35; 2nd class, £24 to £29, av. £27.

Government Inconsistency
The year before the Great War, Canada was overrun with unemployed men and stragglers (says the "Ottawa Register"). The Government said it would do nothing to help them, and left all the burden to private charity. Yet the Government spent over a thousand millions on the war in the succeeding years. The coming winter is going to be a hard one, and yet the Government will not spend one million dollars to give employment to those who have been unemployed since the war. In why there are revolutions and Bolshevism in many lands, is Canada immune?
CITY WATER SUPPLY
A correspondent signing himself "Anti-Peague" writes calling attention through our columns to the danger of an outbreak of typhoid fever owing to the present restrictions on the water supply in Limerick. The existing situation, owing to no waste being available for flushing purposes, etc., during the greater part of the day, he describes as "a terrible and appalling state of affairs." We may remark that several complaints on this subject were received by a well known medical practitioner, and he has expressed the opinion that the new restrictions, and they should be continued no longer in view of the danger to health and the inconvenience involved.

LIMERICK PRIEST Dies in California
A talented Limerick priest in the person of Rev Father James Madden passed away at San Diego, California, on the 3rd inst. The deceased was born in the town of Limerick, and only reached his 84th year, and his early demise, which is deeply regretted, cuts short a career that was full of promise. He was educated in St. Michael's College, Limerick, and in Marquette College, St. Louis, Missouri, brilliant educational career. For many years, he held the position of Professor in St. Michael's College, and for a year or so acted as Director of the Limerick Normal School. A plan to build the Limerick Cathedral, which was his long ambition, was carried out by the late Mr. Madden, who died on Friday last, celebrating on that day his 84th birthday.

LATE MR SEAN WALL
A collection was held at the Church gates, Monday, Sunday, to aid the fund which is being organized throughout the County of Limerick, for the widow and children of the late Mr Sean Wall, Chairman of the Limerick County Council. There was a generous response to the appeal, everyone taking advantage of the chance to show their appreciation of the late Chairman, whose death is widely regretted in East Limerick.
CATTLE RESTRICTIONS
The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland have made an order which removes as from the 17th inst the existing prohibition of the slaughter of in-calf cattle. The only order which will now remain in force under the Milk (Special Provisions) Act, 1915, is the Breeding Ewes Order of 1915, which prohibits the slaughter of in-lamb ewes.
\$9,000,000 RELIEF
The "Daily Mail," regarding the unemployment problem, says: - It is understood that a large measure of relief is demanded by the Ministry of Labour, and that a sum amounting even to \$9,000,000, may be in question.
PRISONER RELEASED
Mr W Dewans, Oldtown, Hospital, has been released from Brixton Prison, on completion of a twelve months' sentence for a political offence.
