

THE recommendations of the R yal Commis tion that Canadian store cattle be admitted to Great Bettatu has naturelly reneed a good deal

of uncasiness to this country.

Canadian Cattle Menace

Ireland had built up a big industry in the raising of live stock and it is bound to suffer if she shreatened over seas competition materia-

Itieh oathle raisers and exporters look on the prospect of an invasion of the British market by store cattle from Canada with the greatest disquistade, for they rightly conclude that with such competition the expert of Lieb cattle would diminish very considerably.

On their merits, of orners, Irish castle would be well able to hold their own with Capadian cathle, but cross Channel shipping facilities should be greatly improved to give them a fair chance of competing.

A prominent Cork exporter gave his views on this aspect of the question to a Press reprecentative on Saturday.

There would not be she slightest fear, he said, of Irish castle not being able to com pets in the Rogilsh markets, both in prices and quality, with imported Canadian live stock if only proper shipping facilities, with a better method of handling cattle, were prowided for Irish exporters and the present high freights reduced.

The same exporter, it is of interest to note, does not favour the idea of Ireland toking up the dead meat industry instead of the present system of disposing of Irish live stock.

He had pever, be said, he leved shas the den! ment industry would exceed to I:cland Roglish butchers, he added, "would prefer to purchase live stock. The industries orested by manufactures in Ireland from the hider, ballow, hoofs, herne, etc, would probably be enconssful, but would be countered by the difference in price between the live and dead meat, and by the probable failure of the dead ment industry, as that would not be able to compate with live fat stock exporters. If it was made ecopaleory that all fat stock to slaugh, bered in I cland, ossele, sheep and pige, the scheme would be a success, but unless that were so he thought it must fall."
