COOKERY NOTES

Chocolate Icing If a chocolate icing is beaten too much before spreading, the gloss will be lost. It should be spread while it is yet a little "runny," so that it flows off itself to give a smooth over the surface of the cake.

To Make Biscuits Ginger Biscuits—Four ounces each of flour, oatmeal, butter and sugar, half a teaspoonful of baking powder, a dessert spoonful of milk, one egg, and powdered ginger to taste.

Glossy Boiled Icing Boil together two cups of sugar and one cup of water until, when a spoonful of the mixture is dropped into cold water, it will form a soft ball.

Princess Raspberry Loaf Bake a good plain cake mixture in a rather deep pan, soon on the interior and form the outside with flavoured icing.

Brighton Biscuits Take 1 1/2 cups moist sugar, roll flour, salt with 1/2 lb flour, and sift through a fine sieve; rub in 1/2 lb butter; make a hole in the middle and stir in a few ounces of cold water.

Coconut Macaroons Two level cups sugar, 1 lb fine desiccated coconut, 1 pint whites of eggs, Mix all together in a copper stewpan, then stand it over the fire, and stir constantly until the heat of the mixture will just allow the flosser to be borne in it.

Gala Cake Cream one-half cup of butter; add one cup of granulated sugar. Beat two eggs and two yolks until light; add the eggs beat one-half cup of sugar.

Gala Frosting Dissolve four level spoonfuls of molasses, two cups of granulated sugar, in one-half cup of boiling water.

Greengage Marmalade Wash the pumms and cut them into small pieces without removing either pips or seeds; place them in a preserving pan with a very little water, and simmer till tender.

Chicken Sandwiches (1) Between the buttered slices of fresh white bread arrange pieces of thinly sliced chicken, with finely shredded lettuce and mayonnaise.

Arrowroot Biscuits Ingredients: 1/2 lb of butter, six eggs, 1/2 lb of flour, five arrowroot, 1/2 pint of milk, 1/2 pint of cream.

Chocolate Sponge To make this, cream one-half cupful of butter and add a quarter of a cupful of cocoa, the well-beaten yolks of two eggs, and one cup of sugar dissolved in half a cupful of water.

Why Bread Cracks at the Sides During Baking Sometimes bread cracks at the sides because the oven is too hot, but more often because too much flour was used in the mixing.

FARMING NOTES

The prices of the wheat variety test which was conducted by the Plant Breeding Station of the Department during the past season at the Agricultural College, Glasnevin, is given in the following table in which the varieties are set out in the order of yield of grain per acre.

It will be seen that the difference in yield between the three leading varieties is very slight. Of the leaders Double White Stand-Up (a Queen White) is a very well-known and generally popular variety, which has some excellent qualities in all the trials conducted by the Department.

Swedish Iron and Yeoman are of comparatively recent introduction, and their character is as yet unknown to the majority of Irish farmers. Both have extremely long straw, and are also remarkably resistant to rust.

Resistance to Lodging Observations made just before the trial plots were shown that the following approximate percentages of each plot were standing at the time of harvest:—Yeoman (average), 100 per cent; Iron, 99 per cent; Queen White, 98 per cent; Double White, 97 per cent.
