NEW IRISH CONSUL. Mr Joseph Connolly, of Belfast, has been appointed by Dublin to be Irish Consul in New York in place of Mr J. J. Frawley. Mr Connolly sailed on Saturday in the "America" from Cork to take up the position. Mr Frawley resigned some time ago on his return from America and has since been given a position under the Dublin Bureau of Statistics. Mr Connolly is a Belfast business man who has given good service to the Irish cause and has been a keen student of the industrial and economic needs of Ireland. He is also interested in literature and will be remembered as the author of a play entitled "The Miss Land," produced in the Abbey Theatre, Dublin, a few years ago.

GRAIN FOR LIMERICK. The United States Steamship, Noshaba, 3,776 tons net, and the Japanese Steamship, Tyne Maru, 4,254 tons net, arrived in the lower Shannon last week, both with cargoes of grain from Portland, Oregon, for Messrs Bannans and Son, Limerick, and docked this week for discharge. They are now loading vessels and lie, the Tyne Maru at the south side and the Noshaba at the north side of the dock. The Tyne Maru with a gross tonnage of 6,773 has a net tonnage of 4,254, while the gross tonnage of the Noshaba is 6,662 and the net tonnage 3,776.

FARMERS AND DISTRICT COUNCIL. At a meeting of Glou Farmers' Union on Sunday the following was adopted:—"That we believe the District Councils misunderstood the object of our recent agitation, which was only to discuss the matter in a friendly manner, and that we have not refused to pay our rates but the high rate of 19s 7d, and that we are willing to pay the average county rate."
