

AT LONDON RECEPTION AN IMPORTANT SPEECH

When Irish Peace Comes

An enthusiestic welcome was accorded to the delegates of the Irish Republic at the Albert Hall, London, on Wednesday night by the Irish rocteties and Irish residents in London. The doors were thrown open an hour before the reception was to begin, and within half an hour nearly,5,000 people had taken their places in the arona and the boxes. The time of waiting was whiled away by the Irish Pipers, who played popular national airs. The vast build. irg was practically full when the delegates made their appearance. There was wild cutburst of cheering which lasted for nearly two minutes whilst they sook their seats on the platform. Mr Michael Collins came in for aproisi novise, and was arested with renewed srice of "Good Old Michae." During the early part of the proceedings representatives public, presented a wreath, "In Remembrance of the herold Terence MacSwiney." Mr Art O'Brien, as the representative of Dall Elreann in Great Britain, extended to the delegates, " a hundred thousand Gaelle welcomes, on behalf of the Irish population of Great Britata."

Me Arthur Griffith, who had a rousing walcome, after thanking the audience for the wonderful reception they had given his colleagues and himself, said he was debarred from dealing with political subjects, but he added ; "When we goes as this vacs gathering of our exiled fellow countrymen and fallow country women, we feel the strength, the solidarity. and the unconquerableness of the Irish race. 


