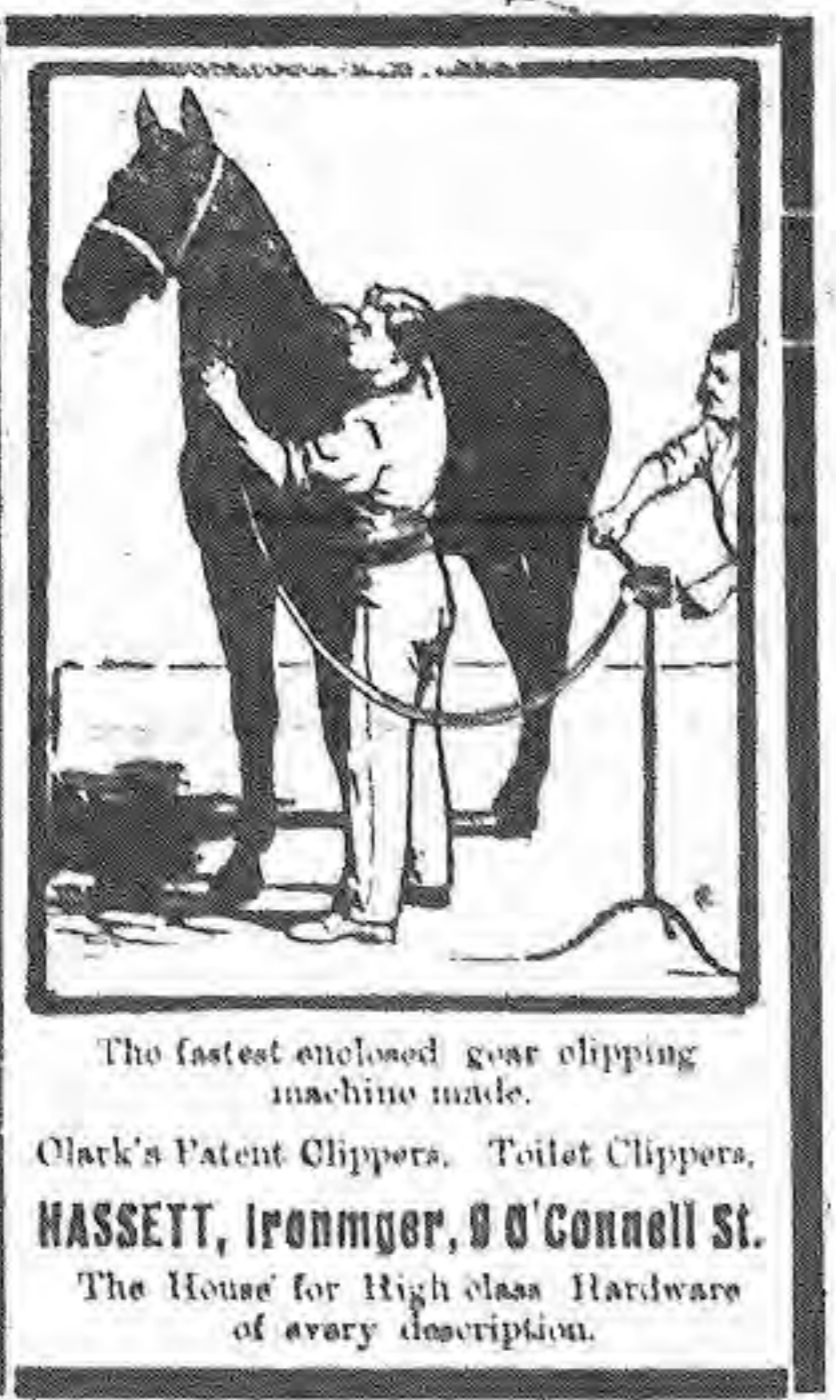

NEWCASTLE WEST UNION BOARD AND COUNCIL MEETINGS Question of Boarding Out Children

Appointment of Cottage Tenants Mr D O'K Noonan, Co. Co. V.O. presided at the last meeting of the Newcastle West Board of Guardians, and the other members present were—Messrs B Beldy, T O; P Buckley, T J Ambrose, J P O'Connell, P M O'Connor, T Harbath, P Donohue, J Mahony, J Dalton, M Bagley, J M O'Brien, P O'Shea, D Corbett, B Donohue and J Mahony.

"NO MONEY AVAILABLE" The meeting was held specially to consider winding up of affairs of the Workhouse and taking over outdoor relief and other transferred services, if financial aid was given. The following order was made:—No money being available, adjourned to next meeting.

BOARDING OUT CHILDREN. A letter was read from the Department of Local Government in regard to the proposal to board out Mary and Margaret Tobin, of Ballybally, stating that they consider that the accommodation in the proposed Foster Home is too limited, and that the Guardians should endeavour to secure a more suitable home for the children.

District Council A meeting of the District Council was held. KILMERRY BURIAL GROUND Mr Patrick O'Shea, p.m., presided, and was granted permission to erect a new and improved burial ground, which is interfering with the tombstones.

APPOINTMENT OF COTTAGE TENANTS Mr J M O'Brien proposed:—"That the widow of Jos. Fitzgibbon be appointed tenant of the vacant cottage at Templemore, Secundered by Mr J Dalton and passed unanimously." NOVEL OFFER Widespread interest has been aroused by the offer of Mr F Egan, the famous auctioneer and well-known farmer, to hand over a farm worth £20,000 to a committee of his employees who will be selected to purchase the property and the proceeds. The offer was not accepted, and it is now extended to any reputable labour body, such as one or other of the agricultural workers' unions.

BIG AWARD The final of Limerick was awarded £20,000 to Farmer Quarter Horse, a champion of the Limerick District, and was presented to him by the Mayor on April 30.
