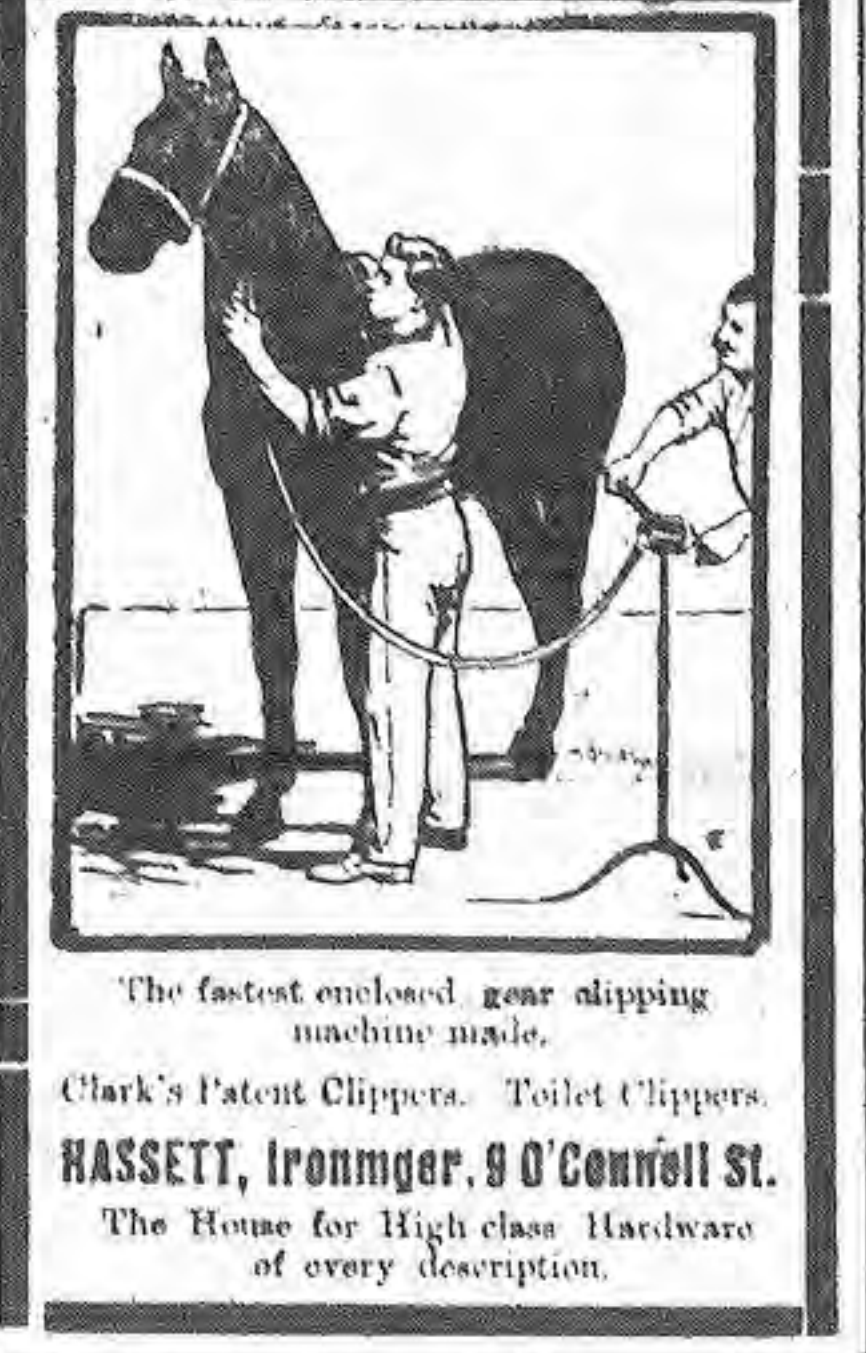

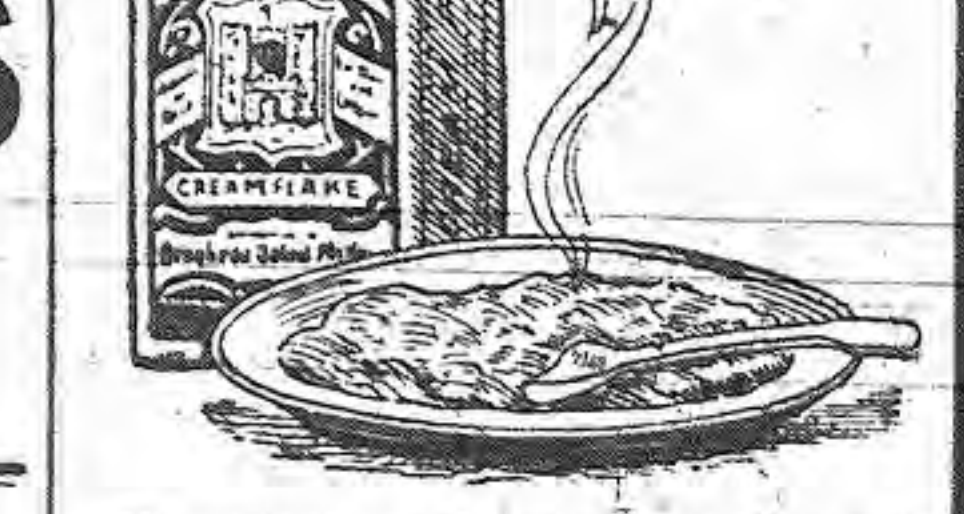

Irish Peace Prospects

Nothing in the way of really definite or authentic information has been transmitted to the proceedings at the Anglo-Irish Peace Conference.

Most of what is being dished up day after day by the London Press regarding the matter is merely guess-work based on a balancing of probabilities.

It is stated that the 'Free-man', writing in today's issue of this paper, says: 'The Irish Peace negotiations will have succeeded or failed by the week-end. Unless all the indications are misleading, a settlement is imminent. At least this is the view held in Government circles.'

The same correspondent, who is usually well-informed, says that 'among politicians more closely associated with Downing Street and the Irish Office, every confidence is expressed that a solution of the Irish problem is only a matter of a few days.'

Statements of a similarly optimistic character are being freely traded these days and, fortunately, there appears to be some ground for them.

Lord Carson, it is stated, certainly wants peace, and the London correspondent of the 'Independent' says that he is at present acting as an intermediary between the British Cabinet and the 'Government' of Northern Ireland.

The statement was made yesterday that Sir James Craig had been summoned to London in connection with the Conference, but according to the 'Herald' this is a mistake.

That the 'Premier' of the North East corner is going to London is, however, admitted, and it is considered as likely that he will be called into Conference later on in reference to the Irish Peace negotiations.

While nothing definite is known regarding the proceedings at the Conference, many indications go to show that things in this respect are looking brighter than they were.

The outlook appears pretty rosy, at all events, and the hope is at least general that the optimism prevailing will be fully justified by the reality.
