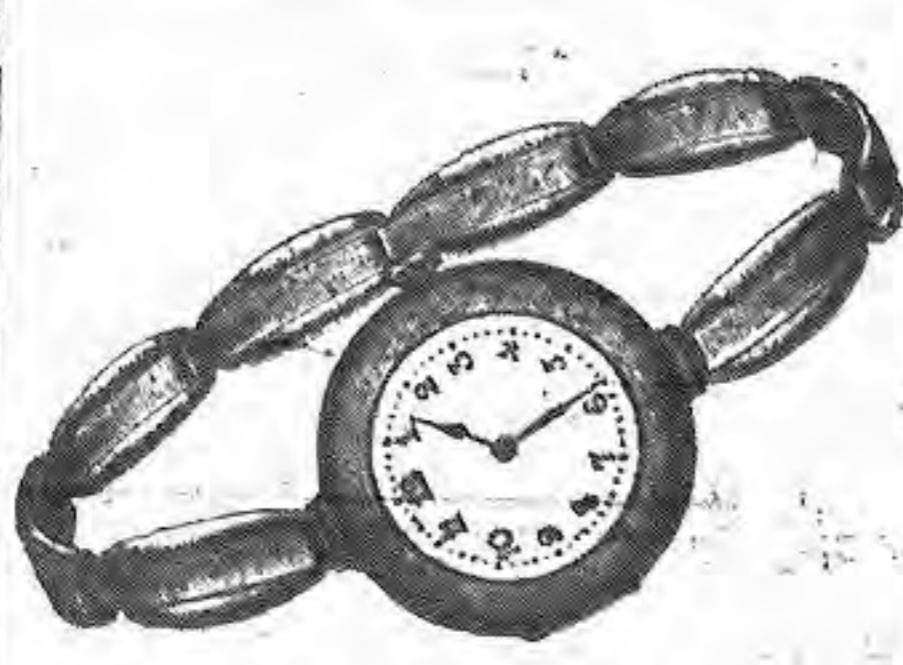

The following is the Department's return of the average wholesale prices of agricultural produce as certain Irish markets during the week ended 30th October, 1921, as compared with the previous week.

COOKERY NOTES

Nut Macaroons Add slow y one cup of best brown sugar to the beaten white of an egg.

Pickled Onions Select the smallest "waterkins" peel them, wash and add in cold water for a couple of days.

Tomato Sauce Put three tomatoes into boiling water for a minute and remove the skins and seeds.

A Nice Sauce Sometimes a plain pudding demands especially nice sauce, such as this: Put one yolk of two eggs into a small saucepan.

Tomato Relish This is mild, and delicious served with meats, oysters, or vegetables.

Cake-making Hint If you want a light, fluffy cake to be eaten the day it is made, use the yolk and whites separately and very lightly.

Baked Fish Prepare two pounds of cod by taking out the bone and leaving the outside skin.

Onion Roly-Poly Onion roly poly makes a really good substantial dinner if served with plenty of unseasoned brown gravy and a green vegetable.

Cauliflower Pickle Select nice crisp cauliflower, break up into very small pieces, and spread on a dish.

Marrow and Fig Jam Required: About four pounds of marrow, two pounds of figs, four pounds of sugar.

Tomato Ketchup Wash and cut up a quantity of sound tomatoes. Put into an enameled saucepan without any water and boil quickly until soft.

Chow-Chow To make nice chow-chow you require a quart of green peas, some quantity of small onions and of French beans.
