We were chatting a few days ago about the Religious Orders of the Church (writes Will Lacey in the Standard of October 15th). There was mention of the Jesuits, of the Passionists, the Dominicans.

Nothing cold in the welcome, no chilly formalities; my bag was taken from me before I had even had time to say I myself, and the monk took it to the room...

"Did it ever occur to you," said he, "how much trouble comes of talking, and how unnecessary much of it is? A quick word often saves us much noise and ill-feeling. It is better everybody would be a little lighter about what was placed on the tongue."

"How long have you been in the order?" I asked him. "Only four years," he said, "and they have been the happiest years of my whole life. I am in a position to judge of what this Trappist life is like."

"In the winter months the monastic rest is done away with, and all retire at 7 in the evening. With certain minor variations, owing to local conditions, this is the order of the day. The Trappist Monasteries all over the world. Up to fairly recent years the Trappist rule provided for rigorous and long fasts. In Lent, for example, no food was taken until 4 o'clock in the afternoon.
