





Should the labourers parates in this demand and use the weapon of stopping the milk at the creameries we resolve to reales it by every means in our power, and call on the farmers, large and email, to support the action shis branch of the Farmers' Union

FORTY-TWO STOREYS HIGH.

The highest building west of the Mississippi, Bys Popular Mechanics, is in Seattle, Wash-Egica, The tower rises 450ft. above street ferel, and is so conspicuous that it is used as B beacon by mariners in making their way on Ford Sound, The building covers a plot that is 106ft. by 1:0ft. The main structure is twenty-one storeys high, and to this the towar adds twelve storeys. In addition to this there are two storers below street level. In Germany the treatment found to be most efficacions was the fol lowlug-known as the Lebmann method ;-The straw, provious'y shopped up, is seeeped for six hours in a solution of saussis soda, concentrated at from 3 to 5 per cent. It is shee passed, soaked in the liquid, into a boller where le is asseamed for about six hours The soda liquid, which is deeply coloured by the material soming from the straw while it is dissolving, is drained (if and the residue is washed in clear water until all traces of soda have disappeared. The produce, afser shis washing, sao be used as it is, or can be dried if it has to be transported to a distance.

In the source of this treatment from 25 to 40 per cent of the nutritive substances of the straw pass into the soda solution and are loss

#### HENS THAT HATCH FISH.

As is generally known, a big quantity of Ssh-spawn is annually lost. To avoid this fish-rearers in China carefully collect spawn from the surface of the water, and when they have secured a sufficient quantity they take a number of hens' eggs, the contents of which have been carefully emptied through a small speriure, and refill the shells with the spawn. The holes are then sealed up, and the eggs mus under broody hens. The hens are allowed to incubate the eggs for a cartain number of days, when the eggs are again broken and Abeir contents put into water that has been previously warmed by the sun. In a very abort space of time the spawn hatches, and she young fry are then kept in pure fresh water until they attain a sufficient size to be get into the ponds containing older fish. The Chiness have long understood all the intricasies of incubation, and were amongst the first to use incubators for the hatching of hen mggs, long before such machines were made in this country. At one time a considerable business was done in this style of spawnbatening.

A solution of ande was used which, was estoniated to obtain a neatral product, the excess of soda to ng neatrailand by the solds which form during the cooking process-thus avoiding the washing in water. The following is a desoription of the method adopted :-

The straw is steeped for one night in a solusion of 1's per coas sods. The liquid is then drained off, and the straw is transferred to as ordinary versionl farm boller, which admits eteam in the lower purt. An hour sfeer the mixture has been completely heated steaming is discontinued. The liquids formed during con densation are then drained off and the product is socied. It is of a brown colour, has an agreeable smell, and is readily eaten by cattle and sheep.

The principal of jablons to the treatment with sods are based mpon the diffinities in manipulating caussic soda, and on she exces sive maisture in she resultant forage. The first diffinity, is is suggested, can be remedied by using in place of caussio sods a mixture of soda and quies lime, which when hot produces causeiu soda. The second is a masser of thorough draining.


