

COMMERCIAL SOOT

What we call soot when it is in the wrong place becomes a valuable commercial preduct when manufactured to order. According to its source it is called lanipblack, earbon black vine-block, wood-pulp black, and so on. Roy O. Neal, of the United States Bureau of Mines, who writes on the manufacture of earbon-black in Oil News (Chicago), tells us that this name is given to the finely divided soot deposited on a metallic surface by burning gas, as distinguished from lampblack, which is the soct thrown off by the smoky fame of oil or tar burnt in an incufficient guantity of air. The gas used for making carbon-black is now, usually natural gas, and some twenty thousand tons of it are produced annually in this country, mostly in West Virman. The product is also referred to as gas. black, natural gas black, chony black, jet-Mack, hydrocarbon black, satin gloss black, is several processes of manufacture are described, such as the " descal " process, where the soot is deperied on moving channelled tables of metal, whenee it is removed by scrapers ; the rotating dise process, where a cast iron disc three feet across revolves horizontally over radially percanad gas hurners, and scrapers; the " plate " process, in which the metal plates Mand still while burners and scrapers rotate; and the "roller method," which uses metal sollers eight inches thick, with burners and serupers as in the other methods. Some black is made by decomposing oil vapour with heat, but the product is said to be heavy and tarry.




