SHEEP DIPPING. The sheep-dipping season having now commenced, the attention of sheep owners and of all concerned in the administration of the Sheep Dipping Order to the special necessity which exists for complying or securing compliance with the requirements of the principal Order this year. The Order of 1915, which, with the Orders enabling local authorities to require sheep in their respective districts to be dipped under the supervision of local inspectors, is aimed at the eradication of the disease known as sheep scab, the creation of more favourable conditions for developing the sheep-breeding industry and the safeguarding of the valuable sheep export trade.

VENERABLE CLERGYMAN MURDERED. House Afterwards Burned. The Very Rev. John Finlay, M.A., aged seventy-nine years, was taken from his residence, Bawnboy, Co. Cavan, on Sunday morning and shot dead. It is stated that a number of armed and masked civilians knocked at the door of Dean Finlay's house early in the morning, and on obtaining admission seized the reverend gentleman and took him outside. Several shots were fired at him, and when he fell to the ground his head was beaten to a pulp by a blunt instrument. The raiders then set fire to the house, which was completely destroyed.

THE BELFAST BOYCOTT. Priest and Others Charged at Waterford. Rev. Father John Loughrey, C.C., Thomas Town, Co. Kilkenny, John Minogue, James O'Neill, and Patrick Ryan, from the same place, were tried by Field General Court-martial at Waterford on Saturday, charged with assembling for the purpose of furthering the trade boycott of Belfast goods under instructions from Dail Eireann; also, with promoting the objects of Dail Eireann. Further charge against Father Loughrey was being in possession of a decree enforcing the boycott from Dail Eireann, signed "Minister of Foreign Affairs."
