WEST LIMERICK BOARD.

Meeting in Rathkeale.

A meeting of the above was held at Rathkeale on Saturday last. Mr. P. Flaherty presided. The delegates attending were: Messrs. O'Halloran and Boyle, Rathkeale; Hannan and Mahony, Newcastle West; Dawson, Dromard; Moade, Kildimo; J. D. O'Connor, Mount Collins; Neligan, Ashford; Wallace and Scanlan, Knockaderry; Walsh, Ballyteague; Toomey, Castletown.

The Secretary intimated that he summoned the meeting acting on instructions received from the Hon. President, Mr. Linton, and the matters on the agenda were to consider if the championships were to be resumed this year, and also to decide the granting of permits to the Committees of Sports meetings, that were being held over West Limerick, presently. He (Secretary) knew that the auspices under which those meetings were being held were very worthy of support, and personally he believed it was the duty of all Gaels to support them. However, there may be a danger of abuse and the G.A.A. being a national organisation, and West Limerick Board representing it locally, the Athletic Council or G.A.A. Congress may censure the Board, being or abolish it completely, if the Board did not take some action where the interests of the G.A.A. and its constitution were concerned.

At the close of a long discussion it was decided to invite the various authorities of the L.L.A. to a meeting, and there decide what course the Board should take in the event of such a censure. The Chairman of the Board, Mr. P. Flaherty, stated that the G.A.A. of Galway is a much better than the G.A.A. of West Limerick. The issue rested on the Gaels of Rathkeale and Newcastle West to decide whether the championships would be resumed, and it was gratifying to note the eagerness of those attending, waiting the replies of the Newcastle and Rathkeale representatives. Both signified their willingness to play within the month of August, and the match was fixed provisionally to be played at Knockaderry, on Sunday, 22nd August, 1921, 2.30 o'clock (old time). This fixture to be semi-final West Limerick Senior Hurling 1920-21. Croom will meet winners for final. Thus the card stands in senior hurling: Junior Hurling stands at Tourist Club v. Rathkeale; Croom v. Bruree. Winners of Croom v. Bruree to meet Kilkormack Newcastle West v. Rathkeale; Newcastle v. Ballyteague v. Rathkeale, semi-final; Newcastle v. Rathkeale, semi-final; Mount Collins meet winners for final. Junior Football: Ballyteague v. Glin, semi-final; Mount Collins meet winners for final.

The semi-final senior football, Rathkeale v. Ballyteague, and junior hurling, Bruree v. Croom, was fixed to be played at Rathkeale on the first Sunday in September, Mr. P. Flaherty, referee.

An application from Rathkeale Volunteers for permission to hold matches on August 21st and 22nd, 1921, was being left open for discussion at the meeting. All members should support Rathkeale on August 21st.

The Chairman, in adjourning the meeting, said it would be very unbecomingly of Gaels if they adjourned without paying a tribute of respect at this their first meeting to a respected member of the Board, the late Commandant Sean Finn, I.R.A., who was killed in action. Sean was gone from this organisation, but still his memory lived and would live, and he hoped that his memory would be a guide and an inspiration to the Board in all their councils, knowing as they did the noble qualities of Sean, his calm and gentle demeanour at the meetings and on the hurling field. He now requested the Board in future to try and emulate the virtues of Commandant Finn, soldier and gentleman as he surely was.

The Hon. President (Mr. Linton) and the Secretary joined with the Chairman in the tribute to the late Commandant Finn, both making touching references to his memory, all members standing.

The next meeting will be held on Saturday next at Temperance Hall, Newcastle West. SUNDAY AT STRAND. Two very important challenge matches will be brought off at Strand on to-morrow (Sunday). In senior football Newcastle West will meet Abbeyfeale, and as both teams are in good form a great contest should result. In junior hurling Ashford will try conclusions with Newcastle West, which should also prove interesting.

RATHKEALE G.A.A. At the annual meeting of the above, held in the Carnegie Hall, Rathkeale, on Monday evening, August 8th, it was unanimously decided, on the proposition of Mr. P. Flaherty, seconded by Mr. C. Keyes: "That the Rathkeale G.A.A. formerly known as the Abraham H.C. be henceforth known as the Sean Finn H.C."—W. Boyle, Sec. pro. tem.

FOOTBALL MATCH AT ABBEYFEALE. Abbeyfeale and Feenagh football teams met at Abbeyfeale on Sunday in a friendly contest, in presence of a large attendance of spectators. Although both clubs have been out of practice for some time, the match was well contested and disclosed at times some very interesting play, performed in the best of good humour throughout. Mr. G. Scanlan, Lisbowl, refereed. The final score was:—Abbeyfeale, 1 goal 2 points; Feenagh, 2 goals 2 points.

SAUCE AND PICKLE KING'S FAITH.
