TENURE

The premises are described in the Grant as "All that lot of ground part of South Priors Land, in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, marked No. 3 on a Map that day agreed upon and signed by the said Earl of Limerick and Robert O'Callaghan Newenham, containing in front to Richmond-place, George's-street, 26 feet,, and from front to rere on one side 200 feet, be the same more or less, bounded on the South in front by Richmond-place, George's-street, on the East by Hartstonge-street, and on the West and North by lots of ground in the possession of the said Robert O'Callaghan Newenham, as described in said Map."
