

TENURE

Fee-farm Grant, dated 7th September, 1857, made between William Henry Tennison, Earl of Limerick, of the one part, and Louisa Hewitt O'Bryen, otherwise Hoarc. Widow, and Eliza Hoare, Spinster, of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 27th April, 1805, from Edmond Lord Viscount Pery to the Reverend John Hoare.

The premises are described in the Grant as "All that and those the said plot of ground part of South Priors Land, formerly in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, but now by virtue of the Municipal Boundaries Act situate, lying and being in the Borough of the said City of Limerick, and Parish of St. Michael's, marked No. 3 in the said Map annexed to said Original Indenture of Release, and therein stated to contain in front to George's-street 60 feet, and from front to rcre 150 feet, be the same more or less, and to be bounded as particularly mentioned and described in the said Map."

The Grant reserves all mines, minerals and royalties,. and also reserves out of the said promises a passage of at least 7 feet wide at the rere on the South side thereof as a stable lane for the use of the said premises, and of the premises contiguous thereto.

Grantee covenants to keep in repair the premises and all buildings and improvements.
