

Fee-farm Grant, dated 13th August, 1853, made between William Henry Tennison, Earl of Linerick, of the one part, and Mary Brown, Widow, of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 29th October, 1803, from Edmond Sexton, Lord Viscount Pery, to Robert Ryan.

The premises are described in the Grant as "All that plot of ground part of South Priors Land, in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, marked No. 8 in the Map annexed to said recited Original Lease of the 29th day of October, 3803, containing in front to George's street 50 feet, and from front to rere 160 feet, be the same more or less, bounded and described as particularly set forth in the said Map to said Original Lease annexed."

The Grant reserves all mines, minerals and royalties.

The Grantee covenants to keep in renair all houses. edifices, buildings and improvements.

The rent set out in the Rent Column may be liable to adjustment under the Local Government Acts.
