

TENURE Gale Days Yearly Rent

s. d. 14 8 0 Fee-farm Grant, dated 5th October, 1885, made 25th March between William Hale John Charles, Earl of and Limerick, of the one part, and Henry Wallace 29th Sept. of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 20th August, 1804, from Edmond Lord Viscount Pery to Joseph Fisher.

> The premises are described in the Grant as "All that and those so much of the said plot of ground demised by the said recited Original Indenture of Lease as remained unsurrendered, containing in front to Mallow-street 28 feet, and in depth from front to rere 100 feet, be the same more or less, and which said premises are situate at Mallow-street and Pery-street, in the Parish of Saint Michael, and City of Limerick."

The Grant reserves all mines, minerals and royalties.

The Grantee covenants to keep in repair the granted premises, and all houses, buildings, and other improvements.

The Landlord's part of the Original Lease is not forthcoming.
