Fee-farm Grant, dated 13th August, 1852, made between William Henry Cecil Tennison, Earl of Limerick, of the one part, and William Dunscombe Russell of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 18th day of July, 1803, from Edmond Lord Viscount Pery to William Russell.

TENURE

The premises arc described in the Grant as "All that and those the said lot of ground, part of South Priors Land, in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, containing in front to Georgestreet 48 feet, and from front to rere 150 feet. be the same more or less, bounded on the North in front by George-street aforesaid, on the East by a new intended street, agreed to be 60 feet wide, and on the South and West by other holdings belonging to the said William Russell."

The Grant reserves all mines, minerals and royalties.


The Grantee covenants to keep in repair the premises and all houses, edifices. buildings, and other improvements.
